### BACKMAN COMMITS SUICIDE AFTER SHOOTING AT WIFE

Miner at the Pittsmt. Said to Have Been Under the Influence of Liquor, Gains Admission to the Home of Divorced Wife, Shoots Her in Hip, Takes Another Shot at His Son, Reloads Revolver After Cartridges Fail to Explode and Calmly Shoots Self in Roof of the Mouth, Dying Instantly.

Domestic difficulties were ascribed as the cause of the attempted murder of his former wife and the suicide of Matt Backman, aged 54 years, at the home of his former wife, 231 Locust street, at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon, according to witnesses who testified before Coroner Aeneas Lane at the inquest this afternoon. Mike Boric, deputy sheriff, who was detailed on the case with Under Sheriff Milla, told of his discovery of Backman's body. A few minutes before the suicide Backman shot and inflicted a minor injury upon Mrs. Backman and shot at least once at his eldest son, Arthur.

Mr. and Mrs. Backman was divorced six years ago.

Mike Boric testified today that Backman had shot at his wife and son, that three shells had failed to explode and after the family had rushed from the house, Backman had reloaded his .38 caliber revolver and put a bullet through the roof of his mouth which killed him instantly.

**Abusive for Years.**

It developed at the inquest today that Backman has been making trouble for his wife at intervals ever since he divorced her six years ago. A few weeks ago he visited the family home and in the absence of the children abused his wife. The eldest son looked about the city for his father that evening to "straighten matters out" with him, as he described his purpose.

A few days ago Backman went to the family home in an intoxicated condition, according to the son and when he started abusing Mrs. Backman, Arthur led him out to the gate and told him to leave. The following day he returned in similar condition and continued his abuse. Frequently in times past he was denied admission to the house because of his being intoxicated.

**Shows Little Belligerency.**

When he appeared yesterday afternoon he did not appear to be drunk at first and he was disposed to be orderly. He talked for some time with his former wife. Mrs. Backman was humming the strains of a song when Backman asked her if that was "Jesus Lover of My Soul." She replied that it was not and told him the name of the song. There was some little argument over the name of the song, but it did not assume serious proportions. Backman was sitting with his head resting on both hands, when he suddenly got up and walked to the kitchen. Without warning he suddenly pulled a small revolver from his pocket and fired at Mrs. Backman, the bullet inflicting a flesh wound in the hip. Mrs. Backman, unaware then of her wound, fled into the pantry with her youngest son, Arvid, closing the door behind them. Hearing the shot, Arthur, the eldest son, ran into the house and as he opened the kitchen door his father fired at him, the bullet going wild. As he fled from the house into the yard, Backman fired another shot at the boy and pulled the trigger of the revolver three more times, but the hammer failed to explode the cartridges, merely mashing the primers.

Arthur ran to the home of a neighbor and called the sheriff's office. Then he returned to the house and in the absence of his father from the kitchen rescued his mother and brother from the pantry and took them to a neighbor's house. As Mrs. Backman entered the neighbor's she collapsed.

**Coolly Kills Himself.**

Backman in the meantime walked into the front room and having reloaded the gun before he left the kitchen he coolly sat down on a davenport, and placing the muzzle of the gun in his mouth, fired, the bullet penetrating

### PRICE OF SHELLS IS GOING DOWN

Experience of France When it Found Immediate Action Necessary.

Paris, April 2.—It was not until the Battle of the Marne was at its height when war munitions were running low that the French government realized the imperative need of an intense production of war material, according to statements made by Albert Thomas, minister of munitions, in the chamber of deputies. M. Thomas was speaking in reply to criticisms of the conditions under which war material had been supplied to the French army.

From his assertions, it appears that the French war department had estimated before the war that it would be necessary for state arsenals to produce not more than 13,000 shells a day. In the belief that the conflict would be short, no provision whatever was made for the production of explosives during the hostilities.

When it was discovered, during the battle of the Marne, that this estimate was insufficient, Alexandre Millerand, then minister of war, summoned to Bordeaux the heads of all manufacturing establishments available and organized them into groups for the rapid production of three-inch shells.

Neither the government nor the manufacturers had then any basis for figuring the costs. The exceptional conditions and the great need of immediately replenishing the supply, M. Thomas said, accounted for the abnormal prices and for the fabulous profits reaped by the manufacturers. Three-inch shells at that time cost the government 15 francs each. Today they are purchased at prices ranging from six francs and fifty centimes to seven francs and fifty centimes.

The French war department has placed 4,000 contracts for artillery, projectiles and explosives since September, 1914, M. Thomas said. All munitions-producing plants in France, he added, have been under the control of the state from the beginning. Referring to deputies who demanded that all industries able to contribute to the national defense should be requisitioned by the government, M. Thomas declared that this would cause disorganization. He accepted a proposal for a regime under which the state

### ALL BUT THE CORPSE THERE FOR FUNERAL



There is a horrible suspicion that the city authorities were connected with this outrage and that the body of Prinnie was taken to the garbage reduction plant, in accordance with a city ordinance.
