## CALLAHAN HAS BIG PROBLEM ON HAND

Does Not Know Who to Pick to Take the Place of Old Honus Wagner.

Pittsburg, April 6.—Jim Callahan has one of the biggest problems on his hands that ever confronted a big league manager.

It is the problem of doing the impossible—finding a successor to Honus Wagner.

For the first time in some 20 years the Pittsburg club will take the field without the services of the great German, one of the greatest natural ball-players of all time and the idol of Pittsburg fans.

Matrimony and increasing difficulties in keeping in condition have caused Wagner to leave baseball. Salary was no consideration.

Wagner was the first to realize he could not expect a big salary this year and at a meeting in Pittsburg several months ago agreed to play for a largely reduced salary, if he played at all.

But Wagner will never play National league baseball again, which means he will never play baseball again, and this furnishes Callahan's problem.

Callahan has three prospects to take Wagner's place, Jim McAuley, Alex McCarthy and Charley Ward.

At present there is no certain indication either of them will last out the season because not one of them has shown any batting strength.

McCarthy and Ward are brilliant fielders, and Ward looks particularly good in this capacity. McAuley played well enough with Rochester last year, but who may need more major league experience.

Right now Dreyfuss realizes he will have to develop one of the three into a hitting infielder or go out during the season and buy him another man, and Dreyfuss knows it is no easy proposition to buy up good infielders who can hit and field. Every club in both leagues wants them.

Each Saturday there has been an increase in the number of children to attend the gymnasium recreation work offered under the direction of Mr. Munsey until now nearly 1,200 have reported to take training both in gymnasium exercises and swimming pool.

These Saturday classes for the benefit of the children of the grade schools were inaugurated several weeks ago by Mr. Munsey in an attempt to develop an active interest in a systematic method of giving playground work and exercises to the children of Butte during the summer months when school is not in session.

The success of his plan far exceeded his expectations and he is now working to organize a playground recreation center which will give all of the boys and girls of Butte an opportunity to enjoy such privileges this summer.
