NEW PARISH HOUSE TO BE OPENED NEXT WEEK

Three Big Affairs to Be Held on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

Wednesday, Thursday and Friday evenings of next week will be devoted to an extensive public house-warming when the new parish house for St. John's Episcopal church will be opened. To the rector, the Rev. Charles F. Chapman, the Guild and other organizations and members of the church, much credit is due for their success in adding a splendid improvement to the church and affording Butte additional facilities for wholesome recreation. The parish house is located directly in the rear of the church.

Bishop Faber will be in the city on Wednesday evening and will deliver the dedicatory address when the formal ceremonies will take place. This meeting will be followed by a reception, with another to be held Thursday evening when many organizations and citizens will be present. The entertainment on Friday evening will be more in the nature of a social affair.

COMPELLED TO TAKE DRAPED FLAGS FROM THE RIALTO THEATER

The new sign on the Rialto theater, displaying two draped American flags, is to be removed in response to a protest by the Daughters of the American Revolution. County Attorney Joseph R. Jackson has promised the members of the organization that he will prosecute to the letter infractions of the Montana statute which forbids use of the flag for any but patriotic purposes. Mrs. E. J. Strauburger, state chairman of the committee for the prevention of use of the flag for commercial purposes, and Mrs. A. B. Keith, regent of the local chapter of the D. A. R., have issued a statement in which they say they have been given the support of the majority of the citizens in enforcing the Montana statute.
