

PUBLIC PREPARES TO BUY U. S. BONDS

Investors Getting Out of Corporation Stocks and the Prices Ease Off.

New York, April 10.—Munitions, equipments, metals, oils and a wide variety of specialties yielded one to five points under further pressure today. Ralls and shippings were steady to firm except Delaware & Hudson which was acutely weak. Sales were estimated at 700,000 shares.

Liquidation broadened in the first hour but was checked later on the sudden development of strength in leading rails. The close was a net advance of 1/8 point, or 1/8 of 1 percent, to 118.75.

Precipitous Price Decline Follows Advocacy of Government Control.

Chicago, April 10.—Sensational breaks in the value of provisions market today with a crash today the corn market and then almost instantly wheat and other grain. Powerful advocacy of radical steps by the government to control meat and food prices was the chief factor in bringing about the collapse of the whole series of board of trade markets.
