

**BIAN GIRL PICTURES  
SUFFERING IN HOME LAND**

San Francisco, Cal.—A glimpse into the sufferings of Serbia as a result of the war afflictions is given by the lecture of Helene Losanitch, a student from the University of Belgrade and a native of her native land. She is on a lecture tour through the States in the interests of Serbia.

Losanitch is the daughter of a former minister to England, and she has grown up with thousands of his countrymen on the Isle of Corsica. She has seen many distressing incidents in the flight of her father, and her father, 70, on foot in the mountains in the dead of winter.

Losanitch served as a nurse in Serbia for two weeks in a hospital without railroads or roads of any kind. She said: "My mother found it difficult to get to the front as there were thousands of the same plight and the roads were a rocky wilderness. We were crowded as refugees in a little hut—five persons in two little rooms. Often other refugees came to make room for them. There was no water supply nor coal of any kind. We got up in the morning, so we could go to the hospitals to help."

Losanitch said she had seen people dying in the streets. "And one wondered what portents that could face such a people and come out of it sane and wholesome. The hospitals, and yards were all crowded up carts came every morning and took away the people who died."

**DRD WHEEL IS  
WAY TO BUTTE**

ated Fly for the Butte  
nd Superior Sets a  
New Record.

The largest laminated fly wheel in the world, 60 tons in weight, a part of a new hoisting set for the Butte Superior Copper company, which, when completed, will eclipse all similar arrangements in the world, is now on its way to Butte. A steel flat car was constructed for the purpose of its transport and so as to clear the tunnel and bridge limits of various railroads concerned, Pennsylvania, the Chicago North and the Northern Pacific.

The fly wheel, which consists of 51 circles of a thickness of half an inch and a total thickness of 25.5 inches, is 12 feet in diameter, will weigh 60 tons. The largest in Butte mining history. This is just a part of the hoisting set which the Butte and Superior Copper company has been working on for the past year and a half. The hoist will be similar to but larger capacity than other hoists in the world. The laminated fly wheel has a capacity of 2,000 horsepower alternating current motor, convertible by the addition to the hoist motor and the power to the hoist control system.

The length of the complete set is 64 feet 6 inches, while the length of the present set will be 37 feet. The hoist will be completed by the middle of June. The hoisting set is being manufactured by the Pennsylvania Electric company of Erie, Pa., is supplying the equipment and supervising its installation. **BUTTE MINERS INVENT  
MODERN MINING SHOVEL**

F. Salmon and T. Harris Have  
the Patent Pending in  
Washington.

Two local miners employed at the Mountain View mine, Fred Salmon and Thomas Harris, have a patent pending in the United States patent office for a mining shovel which will "muck" from 150 to 175 cars of rock per shift.

The new machine, which may be operated by steam, air or electricity, may be attached to cars to receive the rock, and by its own power will haul the train behind it and adjust itself to any position, working down or up on any floor or however rough the bottom. The patent may later be converted into a machine that will work in the stopes. It is so arranged that it will do excellent work in any mine in the world.

The young men who are concerned in the patent have been working in the Butte mines for a number of years and have given much study to the methods of mining. The machine is said to be very economical and will work in the excavation of tunnels on railroads and for the excavations for buildings.


