Robert M. Fry has just been commissioned postmaster at Park City, according to advices received in Butte today by Postmaster Phil Goodwin.


STOLEN MONEY ORDERS. Postmaster Phil C. Goodwin has

HANDS DOWN DECISIONS IN ADVISEMENT CASES

Judge Will Call Jury and Set Cases for Trial Next Saturday.

In opening court this morning Judge J. B. McClernan announced that on next Saturday he would call a jury and set cases for trial. Before taking up his law and motion calendar the judge announced decisions in the following cases which he had under advisement:

American Fixture company against the Eagle Loan office and others—Defendants' demurrer to plaintiffs second amended complaint overruled.

Postal Telegraph company against Joseph P. Nolan and others—An order of condemnation ordered issued and commissioners appointed and their compensation fixed.

Fred C. Reiss against Frederick Todd and others—The motion of the defendants to strike from the plaintiffs complaint denied. Ten days allowed to further plead.

Fred Wedlake against Billie Wedlake—Defendant's motion to set aside the default and vacate the judgment denied.

G. L. Bateman against G. L. Bruno—Judgment as prayed for ordered in favor of the plaintiff and against the defendant with costs.

Eleven divorce matters occupied a place on Judge McClernan's calendar today.

In the order to show cause why alimony should not be paid in the suit of Agnes LeBeau against Percy O. LeBeau there was a stay of execution granted for one week on the promise that the defendant would comply with the order.

In the case of George Buskowitz against Mary Buskowitz the order to show cause was dismissed.

Frank Matteucci was directed to pay his wife, Pauline Matteucci, \$40 a month alimony and an attorney fee of \$50.

William Rabey was ordered to pay his wife, Ida J. Rabey, the sum of \$30 a month and an attorney fee of \$50.

Chester Hamilton was directed to pay his wife \$20 a month for the support of herself and two children, together with an attorney fee of \$50.

William E. Mothorn was given a divorce from Bertetta May Mothorn on the ground of unfaithfulness. The plaintiff said that his wife associated with other men and that sometimes she got "stewed."

Wanne Saarkoski was given a divorce from Emma Saarkoski on the ground of unfaithfulness. The couple were married in this city in 1909.

Margaret Kusturica was granted a divorce from John Kusturica on the ground of desertion.

Clara Hayden said that her husband deserted her in 1911 and she was given a divorce.
