GOVERNMENT AUTO TAX WOULD WORK HARDSHIP

Local Dealers Say the Proposed Levy Would Curtail Industry.

That the proposed federal tax on automobile manufacturers will work a hardship on the industry is the claim of local auto dealers, who are watching congressional action with reference to this closely. "Such a tax as has been proposed," said a prominent local dealer today, "would curtail promotion and expansion of the industry. Manufacturers' profits are not excessive. In fact they are small compared with the big investments and the uncertain and changeable nature of the business. I think everyone will agree that automobiles are as great a national necessity as railroads and steel mills and I am convinced that it will be to the best interest of the government and the people not to enact a special tax on this industry."

NEW DEVICE TELLS OF APPROACHING STORMS

New York-A device by which the approach of summer thunder storms can be detected hours before the first cloud appears in the sky has been perfected by a New York electric power company. The company needed something of the sort, for on the arrival of a storm there are always increased demands for electricity in a city, and the central station must be prepared in advance. The storm detector is a wireless mechanism which is affected by the electric disturbances going far in advance of the thunder storm itself. The warning signal is given by an ordinary electric bell. When the storm is several hours off, the bell begins to ring at intervals, and as the thunder clouds approach, it gives off a continuous peal.

U. S. WILLING TO SEND 24,000 MEN TO FRANCE

(Continued from Page One.) In detail our general war plans, especially as regards our campaign against enemy submarines. I need only say that that is a question claiming priority above all others. "You will understand that I have fully and frankly explained these problems to your high naval officials. I have every reason to hope that we shall succeed in establishing the closest possible co-operation between the American and allied navies for the assurance of the freedom of the seas, the protection of trade and the triumph of our rights." Conferences between the members of the mission and representatives of the United States continued. ENVOYS ARE UNABLE TO VISIT FAR WEST Sacramento, May 2.-Marshal Joffre, the Rt. Hon. Arthur Balfour and other members of the British and French commission sent to the United States in connection with the war will be unable to visit California, during their stay in America. This information was conveyed today to the office of Gov. William D. Stephens in a telegram from United States Senator James D. Phelan. Senator Phelan says it will be impossible for the representatives of the allied governments to come west. Following the action of California invitations were sent to the ambassadors of the states of Washington, Oregon, Nevada, Montana, Utah and Arizona, asking that they extend their trip across the continent to the west. ROME ANNOUNCES THE MISSION TO AMERICA Rome, May 2.-An official announcement says that the special mission to America will be composed of Prince Udine, eldest son of the Duke of Genoa; Sar Marconi, Marquis Borsari, under secretary for foreign affairs, and Deputies Cluffelli and Nitti, both former ministers.
