MISSOURI CONVICTS GET SATURDAY HALF HOLIDAY

Jefferson City, Mo.—Another innovation is announced for the penitentiary. Saturday half holidays are in effect and will continue indefinitely.

In the past the convicts have been allowed only two holidays, one on Christmas and the other July 4. Under arrangements made by Warden William R. Painter the convicts will work 30 minutes longer in the shops five days in the week and all work will cease at noon Saturday.

The rule in the past has been for the

shops to close at 4 p. m. The new arrangements are very satisfactory to the convicts. Since the walls have been greatly extended there is plenty of room for outdoor amusements. Two baseball clubs have already been organized and various plans of amusement are being worked out.

WILL BE RETAINED IN CITY'S EMPLOY

Several Not on Official List to Continue in Present Positions.

Several present city employees not named last night by Mayor-Elect W. H. Maloney as official will retain their jobs, according to the understanding this morning.

Mrs. Mary Boyle, matron of the emergency hospital, will remain in her present position. She was not officially appointed because of the new mayor's plan to close the hospital at some future date.

City Chemist G. N. Harris will also remain where he is, despite the fact that his name was not included on the official list. The mayor-elect is considering a plan of letting out city laboratory work on the contract system.

Although assistants in the city library were not retained, it is generally believed that all will retain their present positions.

Custodian Attridge at the city corral and his assistant will be retained until that branch of the city administration is closed.

R. J. O'Brien will be plumbing inspector. He will succeed Dominick Evans.

THREATENED TO KILL DIVORCE IS GRANTED

Maude F. Knuckey Given Freedom From Cruel Husband. Other Cases.

Maude F. Knuckey was granted divorce today from A. Frank Knuckey on the ground of cruelty, by Judge McClernan. The couple were married in Anaconda Aug. 31, 1910, and there is one child. The plaintiff, who was represented by Attorney W. E. Carroll, informed the court that her husband had threatened to kill her, ordered her out of the house on several occasions, called her vile names and declared that he would steal the child from her. The treatment accorded the plaintiff by the defendant, according to the statement made to the court, was such that she had to seek medical treatment. The plaintiff was awarded the custody of the child.

Estella P. Panushka and Edward P. Panushka have filed a stipulation with the clerk of the district court whereby it is agreed that the decree

of divorce granted some time ago, so far as it relates to the payment of alimony, may be stricken and that any unpaid alimony may be regarded as settled. The custody of the child goes to the plaintiff.

Ruby Stagg is asking for a divorce from Nicholas Stagg. The couple were married at Dillon Nov. 19, 1899, and there is one child. The plaintiff charges her husband with cruelty and failure to provide. She says that in order to support herself and child she had to go to work as a domestic in a hotel in Missoula.

DROVE CAR ON BIG LAKE.
Lakeport, Mich.—Albert A. Falk flirted with death unknowingly for several hours recently while returning

from a call to a neighboring town. On the way over he encountered several snow drifts and decided to take a different route on his way back. He at first met with great difficulty, not being able to find any road at all, but at last stumbled onto a clean straight away path without a drift.

After driving 20 minutes he came onto a fish slanty and on stopping to get his bearings found that he had made the last eight miles of the trip on the big lake, most of it more than a mile from shore.
