New York, May 31.—Andrew Carnegie, known internationally as the Apostle of Peace, is a war casualty, bereft of reason and money, it became known today when it was learned Dr. Henry Smith Pritchett, president of the Carnegie Foundation, and one of Carnegie's closest friends, has been appointed conservator of the vast Carnegie funds.
