ABDICATION OF CONSTANTINE IS ENTENTE VICTORY

His Successor Assured of Fair Play if He Enters Into No Intrigue.

Paris, June 13.—The vigor with which the French Senator M. Jonnart, on special mission to Athens as the representative of France, Great Britain and Russia, began the settlement of the Greek problem in obtaining the abdication of King Constantine and Crown Prince George has caused much satisfaction.

That he will succeed in helping Greece to get on her feet again in the shortest possible time, notwithstanding many difficulties which still remain, is the unanimous opinion. The new Greek ruler, Prince Alexander, Constantine's second son, is expected to prove friendly to the allies.

Saloniki Expedition.

The Saloniki expedition has been attacked by many in France as useless, but everyone is agreed that the force once there ought to be given every opportunity to accomplish its purpose. It was admitted, with the perpetual menace of a stab in the back from the Greek royalist army, that the expeditionary force was doomed to partial inaction. Encouraged by the moderation of the entente allies, whose over patient policy was attributed largely here to the opposition of the late Russian regime to strong measures, Constantine eluded most of the guarantees extracted from him during June and December of last year, and continued his intrigue with Germany. The blockade alone kept him from active hostility. If he could get the fresh crops into his hands, not only would the entente allies lose a weapon, but he would add considerably to the difficulties of the Venizelist force, who counted on gaining a part of the crop.

Quick Action.

M. Jonnart after a series of rapid consultations with the entente allied ministers and with the Greek premier, Alexander Zaimis, decided upon quick and drastic action and proceeded to Saloniki, where he arranged with General Sarrail for military assistance.

The king's answer to the demand, however, made unnecessary any show of military force. The notice of the king's abdication was couched in the following words by Premier Zaimis:

"The minister and high commissioner of France, Great Britain and Russia having demanded the abdication of his majesty, King Constantine, the undersigned, premier and foreign minister, has the honor to inform your excellency that his majesty the king, ever solicitous for the interests of Greece, has decided to leave the country with the prince royal, and nominates Prince Alexander as his successor."

FAIR PLAY FOR THE NEW KING OF GREECE

London, June 13.—Former King Constantine is still in Athens, although, according to reports, he desires to leave.

Reuter's correspondent at Athens says that all military measures in the Gulf of Corinth and elsewhere have been carried out satisfactorily. In its comment upon King Constantine's abdication, the Westminster Gazette says:

"The allies were absolutely sincere in expressing their desire to protect the integrity and independence of Greece. Prince Alexander will have fair play as a constitutional ruler and his country, if it so chooses, as an honest neutral."

AMERICA TAKING A CLOSER INTEREST IN EUROPEAN AFFAIRS

Washington, June 13.—The United States was not consulted about the allied coup which dethroned King Constantine, it was said at the state department today, and has not as yet taken any part in complex European diplomacy.

So far, it was explained, the United States is more of a military and economic than a diplomatic partner with the allies. But intimations were given today that as one object of the United States in entering the war was to secure a just and permanent peace founded on equitable principles, the United States will begin to exercise an increasing interest in all readjustments in Europe, especially in the Balkans.

Great interest now centers in whether the allies, having dethroned Constantine, will urge Greece to actively enter the war or whether they will be content with her passive neutrality, removing all threat from a rear attack on the forces at Saloniki. The allies have at least 650,000 men in the Balkans.

WAS KNOWN AS THE LIBERATOR OF PEOPLE

The reign of Constantine I. as king of the Hellenes was brief, dating only from March 18, 1913, when his father, George I, was assassinated in Saloniki.

Brief as the reign was, Constantine had enjoyed, prior to the beginning of the great war of 1914, a period of remarkable popularity and had increased the territory of the Greek monarchy

By over 50 per cent. His attitude of opposition toward the entente powers when their troops occupied part of Greek territory in the Macedonian campaign against the Teutonic allies, however, brought him into conflict with the statesmen of Greece and resulted in the establishment of a provisional government headed by Eleutherios Venizelos, whom the king had driven from the post of premier.

Throughout a long series of negotiations and conflict with the entente commanders Constantine was often accused of being pro-German in sympathy, largely, it was charged, as a result of the influence of Queen Sophia, sister of the German emperor, whom he married in 1889. Constantine declared throughout that he desired only to maintain neutrality and that he was actuated not by pro-German sympathies, but by considerations of the welfare of the Greeks.

Born on Aug. 3, 1868, Constantine was educated largely by private tutors from Leipzig, which was said to have stamped upon him a permanent German influence. His military education was furthered by attendance at maneuvers in Germany.

One interesting chapter of Constantine's life is the way in which he became the people's idol. After having been dismissed as commander of the Greek army in 1909 because of popular clamor, Constantine, then crown prince, decided to accept a command in the Russian army, but the opposition to him at home lost its rancor and he was restored to his former dignities.

He finally became a national hero in the Balkan war of 1912, when he led an army of 10,000 Greeks to the capture of Saloniki, causing 30,000 Turks to lay down their arms. His popularity was such, as a result of this feat, that

erman. He was known then as the millionaire owner of some 45 newspapers in Great Britain, who revolutionized English journalism by his American methods, who was despised for his radical tactics and envied for his remarkable genius and foresight.

New Lord Northcliffe comes as the greatest man in England, who opened England's eyes by his revelations of her military inefficiency at the beginning of the war, hammered at the truth until he caused a complete change in the government for the better and is getting action for his democratic demands of the British government.

This human dynamo is 52 years old. He was plain Alfred Harmsworth when, at 20, he left Oxford and started as a 15-a-week reporter. Ten years later he owned more magazines and newspapers than any other man in the world.

Nobility of course, would not read Northcliffe's productions. They were too radical, too lively, too democratic. But their owner pushed them along on the American plan at the risk of being the most despised man in England.

He came out the most envied Englishman and most successful. The public bought his fingers to burn, but read them before destroying them. He bought the Mail and "Americanized" it. He amazed the world by the London Times that still bears the name of "The British Mission."

With his two-score magazines Lord Northcliffe hammered at the inefficiency of the British government, turned public opinion his way, caused a change in the administration of the war which diplomatic historians for the better.

Lloyd George is Lord Northcliffe's man. The small British war cabinet turned almost to make up the slowness of the former administration in prosecuting the war.
