

NOT SPOKESMAN FOR SOCIALISTS

Party in U. S. Says That Dr. Goldfarb is Not Authorized.

Stockholm, June 21.—Dr. Max Goldfarb, one of the American socialists who have arrived here, declared in a report submitted to the Dutch-Scandinavian committee that:

"Although the United States is already in the war, I can say that the position of the American socialist party as a whole is strictly neutral and thoroughly international."

The report calls for the creation of a permanent socialist committee to work for a permanent peace. The second recommendation deals with the composition of the congress which will be called upon to settle the issues of the present struggle and demands a "congress of representatives of the nations and not of the governments."

Dr. Goldfarb continues:

"The governments have forced upon the masses the terrible war. Let the masses force upon the governments such an international arrangement as would make a repetition of this carnage impossible."

Dr. Goldfarb told the committee that he spoke in the names of Morris Hillquit, Victor Berger and of the whole American socialist party, which, he said, "is heart and soul with you and agreed to abide by the Stockholm conference to save the world from the horrors of war."

Three delegates from the Italian minority socialist body, Labriola, Raymond, Lerda, and Cappa, the republican deputy, have arrived.

Although Dr. Goldfarb, who is connected with the Forward of New York, described himself on his arrival at Stockholm as a representative of the American socialist party, socialist leaders in this country state he has not been authorized to act on behalf of the party. Abraham Cahan, editor of the Forward, said yesterday Dr. Goldfarb was not an American but a Russian citizen.

Minneapolis, June 21.—The public safety commission, of which Governor Burnquist is chairman, has within a week closed 43 saloons along the river front.

The sale of intoxicants to women under any circumstances is prohibited.

Saloons have been ordered not to open before 8 a. m. to protect the workmen, and to close promptly at 10 o'clock.

All cabarets have been closed, hundreds of waiters, musicians and others finding themselves out of employment.

Dancing is prohibited in any place where intoxicants are sold.

A man who orders a bottle of beer in a restaurant and then divides it with his wife is subject to a fine.

GERMANS NOW ADMIT LOSS OF THE BREMEN

Kiel Paper Says the Mammoth U-Boat Carried American Securities.

The Hague, June 21.—Wednesday's Neueste Nachrichten of Kiel admits that the mercantile submarine Bremen was lost with a valuable cargo. It says: "The commercial submarine Bremen sailed from Hamburg last August, and unfortunately has not been heard of since. She carried a large parcel of American shares. The proprietors of part of these shares have applied to the railway, demanding duplicates of the shares on the ground that the Bremen and her whole cargo were lost. The railway complied with this request, made out new papers against a deposit of adequate guarantees. As the original shares, registered in prize with the ship, it is desirable to make known, especially in view of the above-mentioned transaction."

On April 13 last the New York Times printed a notice saying that application had been filed here with a company for reinsurance of coupons that have been lost on the Bremen. The value of the coupons was less than \$7,000,000.




