CLAM-MARTINIC GIVES UP TASK

He Asks Emperor Charles to Name New Premier to Form Cabinet.

Amsterdam, June 22.—Count Henry Clam-Martinic, premier of the Austrian cabinet which recently resigned, has failed in his attempt to reconstruct the ministry, according to a dispatch from Vienna. The count has asked Emperor Charles to invite some one else to form a cabinet.

AUSTRIAN WAR AIMS.

Copenhagen, June 22.—Assumption that the survey of Austrian public opinion on war aims, circulated by the Austrian correspondence bureau, represented the Austro-Hungarian government's program of peace terms is confirmed by an article in the Lemberg Gazette, reproducing these conditions of the official government program. The article, for which high authority is claimed, says that Serbia and Montenegro must find their future economic development in close economic association with Austria-Hungary. In other words it proposes a customs union. It declares that Lovcen mountain in Montenegro must be retained as the key of the gulf of Cattaro and that "Albania must be given autonomy under military and economic suzerainty of Austria-Hungary."

Discussing Rumania, the statement says that this question is for Austria-Hungary identical with the Danube problem and arrangements must be made for a free, open Danube route, not subject to the control of any foreign power. Finally that Austria-Hungary must have a better military frontier against Italy, more fully protecting Trieste and the Tyrol.

COLORED MEN TO SERVE IN ARMY

Will Be Assigned to Special Regiments, With Colored Officers.

The Post's Washington Bureau. Washington, D. C., June 22.—All negroes drawn from Montana and other states in the draft for service with the new national army will be grouped into separate regiments and commanded in most cases by negro officers up to the rank of major, according to information from the war department today.

While the war department has so far been unable to determine how many negro regiments there will be in the new national army, because of the uncertainty of the draft, it is thought possible that of the 250 regiments of the new national army that will be formed as many as 40 will be composed of negroes.

These regiments will not be segregated for the time being, but will be sent to the same camps with the other regiments from their divisions. Later, it is possible that the war department might form separate divisions of negro troops, although this plan has not been definitely determined on.

In no case, however, will negro and white troops be put in the same regiments. If small units of less than a regiment be left over from some state's quota, these men will be assigned with similar units from other states to make up full regiments.

WOMAN FAILS IN AN EFFORT TO KILL SELF

But the Wife of Her Affinity is Dead From Bullet Wounds.

Waukesha, Wis., June 22.—Miss Grace Lusk, high school teacher who yesterday shot and killed Mrs. Roberts, wife of Dr. David Roberts, former state veterinarian, and then tried to kill herself by sending two bullets into her body, probably will recover, physicians said today.

To Chief of Police McKay Miss Lusk said: "I am sorry for Mrs. Roberts. I hope my wounds are fatal. I never thought I would do it. I loved Dr. Roberts and want him now and always."

A letter evidently written by Miss Lusk to Mrs. Roberts was made public. It read in part:

"You must have known for a long time that your husband's affections had passed from you; that he cared for some one else. That is sufficient annulment of any marriage vow that ever was given.

"That's the way you respectable folk—good, moral women—do things in order to keep your reputation and live lives of ease.

"In the eternal triangle our souls require for their solution the elimination of one character. The two who should remain are the two whose affection is mutual."

NEW WAR REGULATIONS FOR THE PANAMA CANAL

Washington, June 22.—To meet war conditions President Wilson has approved new regulations for the Panama canal prescribing the length of time belligerent warships may remain in canal waters and the conditions under which they may coal and provision.

To insure a free and open waterway on terms of equality to merchant ships and warships it is ordered that there shall not be, except by special arrangement, at any one time, a greater number of war vessels of any one nation, other than the United States, including those of the allies or such nations, than three in either terminal port and its adjacent terminal waters or more than three in transit through the canal, nor shall the total number of such vessels at any one time exceed six in all the territorial waters of the canal zone. The regulations are in general similar to those governing the Suez canal.

RAILWAY STRIKERS IN RUSSIA BACK AT WORK

Petrograd, June 22.—The strikers on the first section of the Nicholas railway, connecting Petrograd and Moscow, have resumed work, having been given an increase in wages.



Maxim Gorky has issued a furious protest, describing the plan as robbery of our national treasures. He demands a law similar to that in Italy forbidding the export of works of art.
