### TO APPEAL IN BIG LAWSUIT

Butte and Superior Company Will Take Patent Case to Supreme Court.

Attorneys of the Butte and Superior Mining company, after going over the decision given by Judge Bourquin of the federal district court last Saturday in finding for the Minerals Separation company against the mining company for patent infringement, today said that the next move in the famous case will be an appeal taken as soon as notice of the judgment against the mining company is served. The millions of dollars involved in royalties declared due the Minerals Separation company will be determined by an accounting under the supervision of the court.

It was practically understood that an appeal would be taken in the case, whichever way the court ruled. Injunction against the Butte and Superior company prohibiting them from using the oil flotation process of ore separation which is declared an infringement of patent, will act as soon as the formal notice of the court's decision is served. This is expected within the next two weeks.

The recent decision, like the ruling in the Hyde case, will be taken to the supreme court before finally settled, say attorneys. Undertaking on appeal has not yet been started, the attorneys being busy today going over the opinion handed down by Judge Bourquin.

### GIGARS BY TONS GO UP IN SMOKE

Costly Blaze Yesterday in the Basement of Cohn Wholesale House.

Several cartons of cigarettes and cigars originally intended to "go up in smoke" reached the planned destination yesterday noon when the wholesale store of Louis S. Cohn, at 46 West Broadway, was damaged by fire. Two frames, both of whom have equipped tobacco smoke for many years, were overcome when the smoke came too thick. These were Fireman Art Golin and Capt. Joe Boss of the Quartet street station. The men were carried out and later resumed their work at the fire.

The fire is believed to have started because of defective wiring in the basement. The damage will run into hundreds of dollars. Chief Harris being unable to make an estimate today. Much praise is being given to the members of the fire department whose prompt action yesterday saved the big building from total destruction.

### LOSES SUITCASE ON WAY FROM DEPOT TO HOTEL

Pawnshops are being watched closely by the police for a suitcase lost by Miss Schoenfeld of Sheridan, Mont. ### MYERS CALLS FOR A DAY OF PRAYER

Asks President to Proclaim a Day for People to Pray for Victory.

Washington, D. C., Aug. 27.—The war has reached a stage where the grave and reverend seniors of the United States senate are talking of prayer as a weapon against the Kaiser. A senator from Idaho started the talk. In an impromptu expression in the senate he said that "if there is any efficacy in prayer," the whole free world ought to pray for Kerensky, the new Russian leader, and the success of his cause. Subsequently the Idaho statesman explained that what he meant to say was that "if there is any efficacy in prayer in matters of this kind," etc.

Now Senator Myers of Montana has come to the front and introduced the following concurrent resolution: "Whereas, the people and the government of the United States are now engaged in the greatest war of history, which, in its determination, is fraught with great results for good or evil, not only to the people of this country but to the people of the whole world, and which is the greatest undertaking upon which this country has ever embarked; and

"Whereas, it is in accordance with the customs and traditions of this country as a Christian nation and has heretofore been the practice of this country upon engaging in war to set aside a day, by official proclamation for the aid of the Almighty; therefore be it

Resolved by the senate, the house of representatives concurring, that the president of the United States be and he is requested by concurrent resolution to issue a proclamation designating a day of prayer and calling upon the people of this country on such day to assemble in their various places of worship and there offer prayer to Almighty God for the success of our armies and victory for our cause in this great conflict."

The resolution of Senator Myers has not yet come up for action in the senate. There is some curiosity as to what will be the outcome, and it is expected that if the resolution is taken up for action Senator Myers may move to amend by including prayers for Kerensky and free Russia in the proclamation.

### JOHN HENRY O'HEARN IS CALLED BEYOND

Well-Known Railroad Man Succumbs to Attack of Acute Pneumonia.

John Henry O'Hearn, one of the best known and most popular railroad men of the country, died this morning at the family residence, 714 East Second street, after several weeks' illness from pneumonia. The funeral will be held at an hour to be announced later. The remains are at the undertaking parlors of Daniels & Hilborn.

Mr. O'Hearn was born in New York. He was 41 years of age and is survived by his wife and two brothers, Jerry of Washington state and Daniel of Leavenworth, Kan. A sister, Josie Morris of Hilliard, Wash., is also among the survivors.

Washington, Aug. 27.—The Japanese mission visited today in Arlington National cemetery the tomb of Durham White Stevens, the American diplomat who, as official representative of the Japanese government, helped to adjust the controversy with China regarding Korea. ### NAVY LEAGUE WORK WILL GO FORWARD

President Thompson's Letter Calls for Renewed Efforts by Local Workers.

Word has been received by President Eugene Carroll and Secretary Mark Eszelski of the Montana Branch of the Navy league calling upon the comforts committee of the league, the women's section and the Daughters of the American Revolution to continue their work of preparing knitted goods and other articles for the use of the American sailors. The letter follows:

"Secretary Daniels in a notice to the public states that he has directed that no officer, agent or representative of the Navy league will be admitted to any naval station, naval reservation or ship in the navy and that the navy department will not permit the acceptance of anything whatever from the Navy league."

"You have already furnished 150,000 knitted garments for the men of our navy. Certain sections have contributed 20,000 garments for the men of the British, French and Russian navies. It is absolutely unimportant through what channels the garments reach the sailors, but it is important that they shall receive them."

"I therefore, request and direct that for the present, and in default of other instructions by the navy department, you send the garments intended for the men of the United States navy to Mrs. James Carroll Fraser, 1216 Sixteenth street, Washington, D. C., who, acting as an individual, will secure the delivery of the garments to the ships that you may designate."

"Our allies are pressing us to supply them with additional garments for their sailors. Such of you as are willing to work for the allies will please divide your shipments into two parts, sending one part to the comforts committee of the Navy League, Washington, D. C., for delivery to the allies; the other part going to Mrs. Fraser for the men of our own navy."

"We will continue to furnish you with knitting instructions, pictures, samples of wool, etc.; and we will act for you in purchasing wool. All officers of the league will act in their personal capacities in helping the work."

"Remember that the Navy league stands for loyalty and patriotic endeavor, and do not for one moment slacken in the work that you have done for our sailors, and please accept
