

Union Satisfied With Agreement—To Send Committee to Anaconda.

The engineers by a vote practically unanimous last night decided to take no strike vote as suggested by the metal trades council. The engineers took the ground that the contract recently entered into by them was satisfactory and that they did not propose now to question the agreement formally entered into.

Between 250 and 300 members of the union were present at last night's meeting. The engineers have all along held to the self-evident view that the shut down in Butte was due to a walk-out of smelters in Anaconda and to no act or acts on the part of the employing companies.

ARMY PAYMASTER TAKES HIS OWN LIFE

Fort Stevens, Ore., Sept. 6.—Capt. E. G. Krook, army paymaster, attached to the quartermaster's corps here, was found dead in his bathroom last night with his throat slashed. It was officially announced today. On the floor nearby was a blood-stained razor. Fellow officers said they thought Captain Krook took his life because of a nervous breakdown.

WOMAN'S INFLUENCE OVER RUSSIAN WAR MINISTER

Wife of Soukhomlinoff is Also Accused of Treason in Military Trial.

Petrograd, Sept. 6.—Witnesses at the trial of General Soukhomlinoff, former war minister, who is accused of high treason, unfolded in part today the story of Madame Soukhomlinoff, bearing out reports of the influence she established over her husband. She is on trial as an accomplice in the crimes of which the general is accused.

Anna Goshkovitch, a former friend of the Soukhomlinoffs, testified that the young wife of the elderly minister of war frequently expended 100,000 roubles a year. When she was abroad her husband sent her almost his entire salary and for the sake of economy he was forced to eat at the officers' casino.

M. Boutovitch, Madame Soukhomlinoff's first husband, testified that his wife demanded that he obtain a divorce and give her a large sum of money, because she desired to marry General Soukhomlinoff, then governor-general of Kiev. Boutovitch said he had a stormy interview with General Soukhomlinoff, challenged him to a duel and attempted to strike him. His wife pretended she had taken poison, he testified, and refused to take an antidote until he promised to assume the guilt necessary for her divorce and pay her 4,000 roubles a year. She was 25 years old at that time and General Soukhomlinoff was 60.

ABNORMAL CONDITIONS IN THE DAIRY BUSINESS

Labor, Raw Material, Caps and Bottles All More Expensive.

Never in the history of the dairy business have conditions been so abnormal as at present, according to a well-known dairy products expert. According to this expert, labor, raw material, including caps, bottles and everything that goes into the manufacture of dairy products, fluctuate almost daily.

"Butter fat for milk has advanced more than 100 per cent in the past few weeks, but only recently have milk dealers of Butte advanced the prices of their products," declared this expert in defense of the dealers. "They have been selling milk and cream at a loss for the past 12 months. The price of milk and cream is very low in Butte; in fact, it is not more than half the

price these products sell for elsewhere in New York, Chicago, Boston, Detroit, Philadelphia and other large cities the price of milk averages from 17 cents to 20 cents per quart."
