Washington, Oct. 2.—By an order of the interstate commerce commission today the celebrated inter-mountain rate case was practically reopened for consideration of new tariffs proposed by the railroads which would effect increased rates from 10 to 50 per cent on about 70 per cent of the present schedules.

BOURQUIN SIGNS MODIFIED ORDER

Butte and Superior Company is Relieved of Bond in Patent Suit.

An agreement entered into between the Butte and Superior Mining company and the Minerals Separation company whereby the former is relieved of an order to deposit a \$2,500,000 bond was signed by Federal Judge Bourquin in Missoula this morning. The stipulation means that operations at the Black Rock mine will not suspend as intimated in a statement made last week by President N. Bruce MacKevie in New York.

The stipulation which was signed by the officers of the two companies in New York reached Butte last night and A.H. Kremer, of Kremer, Sanders and Kremer, local attorneys for the Butte and Superior, left for Missoula, where he secured Judge Bourquin's signature to the stipulation today.

The agreement becomes effective of date of Sept. 17, the day Judge Bourquin signed the final order in the case. Under the modified court order the Butte and Superior company, in lieu of the \$2,500,000 bonds, must deposit all monthly earnings over the operating expense, with the clerk of the federal court, pending an appeal and final adjudication of the case.

The case grew out of an oil flotation process used by the Butte and Superior company in ore operations. Holding that the Minerals Separation company is the owner of the oil flotation patents, Judge Bourquin found for the plaintiff company.

REPAIRING SHAFT AT RARUS MINE

Work Also Temporarily Suspended at Diamond—Ore Tonnage Increases.

Miners at the Rarus, one of the properties of the Amcenda Copper Mining company, has been temporarily suspended because repairs are needed in the shaft. The miners there have been transferred to the Mountain View. In the meantime, the repair work in the Rarus shaft will be prosecuted and the mine put in first-class shape for large production later on.

On Oct. 1 work was also temporarily suspended in the Alice because of an overproduction of zinc ores. The Diamond mine also is temporarily down, and the men formerly working there have been transferred to the Mountain Consolidated. This will put on full crews at the Mountain Consolidated instead of short crews at the two mines.

The company is hoisting more ore each day and in a few weeks expects to be up to normal figures. Men are being added every day to the payroll.

THREE HUNDRED BOYS OUT FOR SCOUT DRILL

Naval and Marine Divisions Formed—To March in the Sunday Parade.

More than 200 boys turned out last night for the first drill of the Junior Naval and Marine Scouts. The drill was held at the corner of Idaho and Broadway, with Sergeant Speer and Lieutenant Thiesen in charge. The boys were formed into companies and officers were appointed.

It is announced that the boys will, within the next three weeks, begin purchasing uniforms in the new scout companies. The uniforms are bought at wholesale and cannot be purchased except by sworn members of the scout divisions. The Naval Scouts will dress like apprentice seamen of the national navy and the Marine Scouts will wear the regulation marine uniform.

The divisions of Marine and Naval Scouts will march in the parade in honor of drafted men Sunday night. They will carry the national colors and their own regimental colors, a white anchor and club on a field of blue.

TO INSURE SEED FOR THE FARMERS

Washington, Oct. 2.—In order to insure the retention of sufficient seed wheat and rye to sow next year's crops, the department of agriculture today announced that the 30-day grain storage limitation will not apply to seed grain. Lots may be kept for seed purposes until the end of the next seeding season, but cannot be sold at a price exceeding 15 per cent the selling price of No. 1 wheat at the elevator where stored.

PRESIDENT REMITS DISMISSAL SENTENCE OF AN ARMY OFFICER

Washington, Oct. 2.—President Wilson has remitted the sentence of dismissal from the army imposed on Second Lieut. Arthur Brigham, Jr., Sixth field artillery, by a general court-martial, following conviction of having represented himself as a single man when he was in fact married. The officer was a corporal in his regiment and when making application for examination for appointment as a second lieutenant was found guilty of having described himself as single on the official forms.

PATRIOTIC ASSOCIATION SHIPS GOODS TO FRANCE

The room of the Woman's Patriotic association will be open this evening on the third floor of the courthouse for the purpose of affording an opportunity to women and girls who have to work during the day to attend and assist in the work of making articles required by the soldiers and sailors in France for the coming winter.

The 25th box of woollen articles was shipped to France today by the women. It consisted of sweaters, mufflers and helmets, and practically all the articles were made at the rooms in the courthouse. Yesterday a box of goods was received from Mrs. Max W. Atwater and other women of Basin, and it will be forwarded today to France along with the box from the local women.
