

AS THE PRICE ADVANCES

Speculation in Grain Market Still Rife—Prices Are Heavy at Close.

Chicago, Oct. 26. Sharp new advances in the value of corn resulted today from widespread nature and warmth which, if continued, might result in serious damage to millions of bushels. Opening quotations, which ranged from the same as yesterday's finish to the higher, with December \$1.20 1/2 and May \$1.14 1/2, were followed by slight setbacks and then a material upturn all round. On the advance holders unloaded freely and reacted in the market had made prices look too high. The close was heavy, 3/8 to 1/2 higher, with December \$1.19 and May \$1.14 1/2.

Selling of U. P. Stops But Opens Up on N. P. and Canadian Issues.

The cessation of liquidation in Union Pacific stopped on the market today, and shifted to Northern Pacific and Canadian Pacific. Market experts expect a change in Canadian Pacific is coming from wealthy holders who are selling in large quantities.

Time losses were firmer today, most of the issues gaining a fraction in the bidding. Boston experts say that a good deal of the recent selling in copper might be attributed to discouraged Boston speculators who had been heavily loaded with copper stocks at much higher prices.
