TUESDAY IS PROCLAIMED FOOD ADMINISTRATION DAY

Governor Stewart Issues Proclamation Calling Upon the People of Montana to Co-operate With the Government in Its Food Economy Plan. All Are Asked to Sign the Food Pledge. Canvass in Every County of the State Will Be Launched Monday.

Helena, Oct. 26.—Emphasizing the fact that upon the success of the food conservation plan now being worked out in the nation largely depends the success of the allies in the war, Governor Stewart has issued a proclamation naming Tuesday, Oct. 26 as Food Administration day.

The governor urges that the food pledge cards be signed and lived up to and in addition has called upon the clergy of the state to make special reference to this important campaign and to impress upon their congregations the necessity of co-operation in the work.

Commissioners of the state to secure signatures to the pledge cards being Monday. Campaign Director Goss reports that county canvassers declare their great faith in practically completing the work.

Stewart, as governor of the state of Montana, do hereby designate and set apart Tuesday, the 26th day of October, A. D. 1917, as Food Administration day in this state.

"I especially urge that on Sunday, the 25th day of October, the ministers of the churches throughout the state make special reference to this very important campaign and impress upon their congregations the necessity for co-operation in the work. And I sincerely call upon all of the people of Montana to contemplate the responsibility that rests upon them in the existing crisis and express the hope that they should be the first to give their pledge of cooperation during the week following. If the opportunity for everyone to give his or her mite will not be overlooked.

"In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused the great seal of the state to be affixed. "Given at the city of Helena, the capital of the state of Montana, this 22nd day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventeen.

SLAUGHTER GREEKS BY THE THOUSANDS

Turks Undertake Extermination of the Christians in Asia Minor.

New York, Oct. 26.—Not stated by the slaughter of hundreds of thousands of Armenians and Syrians, the Turk has also turned against the Greek Christians in his dominions and more than 700,000 have fallen a victim to persecution in the form of death, suffering or deportation. It was declared here today by Frank W. Jackson of this city, chairman of the relief committee for Greeks of Asia Minor. He said the real details of these new Turkish atrocities were just beginning to leak out.

"The story of the Greek deportation is not yet generally known," said Mr. Jackson, "quietly and gradually the same treatment is being meted out to the Greeks as to the Armenians. Although closely guarded, certain echoes of these horrors come out from time to time.

"There were some two or three million Greeks in Asia Minor at the outbreak of the war in 1914, subject to Turkish rule. According to the latest reliable and authoritative accounts some seven or eight hundred thousand were being deported mainly from the coast regions into the interior of Asia Minor.

"The Greeks of Asia Minor have always been law abiding and perfectly loyal to the Turkish government. Under Abdul Hamid they were well treated, but his successors adopted a program to crush them.

"As the declaration of the present war all persecutions were stopped, but the spring of 1915 brought to the stage a tragic novel drama unique in the history of the world as to its horrors and destructiveness, that is the Armenian deportations; under that innocent name the extermination of a Christian race was started.

"Along with the Armenians most of the Greeks of the Marmora region and Thrace have been deported on the pretext that they gave information to the enemy. Along the Aegean coast Avallians stand out as the worst sufferers. According to one report some 70,000 Greeks there have been deported toward Korea and beyond. At least 7,000 have been slaughtered. The Greek bishop of Avallik committed suicide in despair.

"The latest account from Trebizond shows the towns along the Black Sea are being emptied of their Greek population. From Lynden S. Crawford, missionary of the American board at Trebizond, we have a letter dated July 24, 1917, in which he says the following order came from Turkish army headquarters at Sshehke:

"By 11:23 P. M. the Greek men over 16 and under 50 are to be taken to the front. All such men will be sent further orders later."

"Mr. Crawford also wrote: 'First let us express once more our thankfulness to God for the deliverance He has sent us by the great grand Russian army and people. We are more and more appreciating what the Russians have done for this region. Immediately after the Russian occupation of this province in April, 1916, hundreds of Armenians began to come out of their hiding places.'

"From the Greek minister to the United States, Georges Roussies, I have a letter dated Sept. 21, 1917, in which he says:

"Backed by the Germans, the Turks have put into execution and even organized their widows. They have decided to exterminate the slightest element, which is the most important and most numerous in Asia Minor."

"Under pretext of necessities of war entire populations have been deported. Members of families have been separated. The old, the men unfit for military service, the interior of the country, abandoned without the slightest help and exposed to all sorts of deprivations. The men fit for military service were taken by force into the army despite the fact of having paid for exemption; some of the wealthiest examples have even been called on to pay this exemption fee three times over."

"The relief committee for Greeks of Asia Minor, Mr. Jackson said, has been organized for non-political and purely humanitarian purposes and aims at securing means to aid these Greeks reduced by sudden persecutions to a state of want.

New York, Oct. 26.—Relief from New York's acute sugar shortage within 15 days is promised by E. A. Roiph, chairman of the food administration's sugar division, who today said the price for granulated would be 3 1/2 to 4 cents per pound. Potatoes will be retailed at 3 cents a pound today by the market commissioner through the New York City food committee. They have been 4 to 6 cents.
