GIST OF THE LAW FOR ALLOWANCES

Married Men Must Make Allowment From Pay for Wife or Children.

The county and city local boards today received an outline of the federal law providing for government allowances for the families of married men who are taken in the draft army. The explanation comes through a wire from the governor, who received his information from the provost marshal, General Crowder.

The gist of the information coming to Butte today is that married men in military service must make a voluntary allotment from their pay each month when there is a wife or child depending upon them for support. In the cases of persons other than a wife or child, the allotment from the soldier's pay is voluntary. The government, in the same case, allows a sum toward the support of \$50 per month to follow. This is the order received from the governor today.

In connection with decisions on claims for discharge on the ground of dependency and for consideration in determining appropriate action relative to reopening dependency cases under war-time conditions, the following important extracts from the act of congress approved Oct. 6, 1917, providing family allowances, allotments, compensation and insurance for the military and naval forces of the United States.

"Section 201 provides for allotments of pay of every enlisted man, com-

Family Allowance.

"A family allowance not to exceed \$50 per month, in addition to pay allotted by the man, shall be paid out of the treasury of the United States. Such family allowance shall be paid upon application, which may be made by the man, or made by or in behalf of the beneficiary. No family allowance shall be paid for any period preceding Nov. 1, 1917. Family allowance will be paid from the time of enlistment.

"The beneficiaries entitled to family allowance, and the schedules, follow: "Wife, Child or Children—If there be a wife but no children, \$15. If there be a wife and one child, \$25. If there be a wife and two children, \$32.50, and \$5 per month additional for each additional child. If there be no wife, but one child, \$5. If there be no wife, but two children, \$12.50. If there be no wife but four children, \$20. If there be a wife but four children, \$30, and \$5 per month additional for each additional child.

"Other dependents—If there be one parent, \$10. If there be two parents, \$20. For each grandchild, brother, sister and additional dependent, \$5.

"The act contains further provisions
