HIGH BULKHEADS FOR NEW SHIPS

Vessels Built by Ship Board Make Torpedo Work Harder.

Washington, D. C.—The new fleet of freighters the government is building through the Shipping Board and Emergency Fleet corporation will be as nearly non-sinkable as can be made.

"The reason the Titanic sank so quickly," explained Admiral Bowles, in charge of shipping construction for the Emergency Fleet corporation, "was because the bulkheads extended only up to the middle of the ship. They stopped about at the second lower deck. As soon as the ship had settled to this level, the water poured out the injured bulkhead into the rest of the vessel."

"Our plans require the bulkhead to extend to the extreme upper part of the ship. It will not overflow until the upper deck is immersed, not even if the injury causes the ship to list."

"If the injury can be confined to one or a few bulkheads, the other bulkheads will keep the vessel afloat, at least long enough for the crew to be rescued and brought to the vessel to limp into port."

"It is not likely that three or four bulkheads would be pierced, or that any submarine would fire more than one torpedo, so the chances would be good for the ship to keep afloat."

"One suggestion is urged upon the shipping board has been for ships lying in the water, which would reduce the visibility, but lessens the reserve buoyancy necessary to float in the surface of the water, a little injury sends it below, and it is gone."


