M'LAIN CASE WILL BE TAKEN UP AT 5 O'CLOCK

Postoffice Inspectors of Government Ready to Give Testimony.

The case of W. J. McLain, who pleaded guilty in federal court last week to a charge of taking money from the mails and whose sentence was declared reopened on Monday by the court, will be heard this afternoon at 5 o'clock. Postoffice inspectors are in the city and the government will ask that their testimony be considered this afternoon in the sentencing of McLain.

Alberta Cruzon, postmistress of Kendall, under indictment for alleged embezzlement, asked time in court today to obtain an attorney. She will plead tomorrow.

Ernest Owen pleaded guilty to introducing liquor upon the Flathead Indian reservation. The government was given until next Wednesday to present evidence showing an aggravated offense.

Z. A. Walbridge, postmaster under indictment, pleaded not guilty today. His case will be set for Billings.

The case of William, Adolph and George Moody was continued, the defendants not being in court. The defendants live so far from the railroad that the court is allowing them ample time to receive their notices and get to this city. The men are under indictment for alleged seditious remarks against the military forces of the United States.

CASES AGAINST STREET RAILWAY ARE DISMISSED

The justice court appeal of Eridget Newman against Ed Rose is before Judge McClernan and a jury today. The damage suits of M. MANGS RELEASED UNDER WRIT OF HABEAS CORPUS

Judge Bourquin Holds His Case a Parallel to That of John Beck.

Judge Bourquin of the federal district court today allowed issuance of a writ of habeas corpus in the case of Fred Mangs, a Finlander, who was held in the county jail on a charge of desertion from the army. In its decision the court held that Mangs is an alien and that he followed the rules prescribed for aliens who wish to be excluded from army service.


"The case is similar to the Beck case," said the court. "The man is an alien and subject to exclusion under the draft law. Those who think that aliens should be drafted into the army must remember the feeling that would sweep over this country if Turkey, Bulgaria or Austria should declare that American citizens in those countries must serve in the armies of those foreign nations."

Judge Bourquin did not render a written decision, merely outlining his stand in the matter in open court and pointing out that his decision in the Beck case would practically cover the Mangs petition for the writ.
