OFFICERS CHARGED WITH BURNING THEIR VESSEL

Ship Was Wrecked, Then Set Afire, is Charge Against Captain and Mate.

Honolulu, T. H., Nov. 23.—Second Mate Wilson of the schooner Churchill was brought here today from Maui by federal authorities, in connection with the burning of the vessel with a cargo consigned to the British consul at Seattle, after it had been wrecked on French frigate shoals Oct. 25.

Captain Granzow of the Churchill has been ordered arrested following affidavits by sailors that he and First Mate Anderson bored a hole in the hatch and poured paraffine on the cargo just before rescue. Granzow was born in Germany, but claims American citizenship.

Officials of the navy and secret service here are investigating the act as one friendly to Germany. It was announced today.

Granzow will be tried in San Francisco.

FALSE REPRESENTATION CONCERNING RYE SEED

Louis Cooper is asking for a judgment against August Benz for the sale under alleged false representation of rye seed. It is claimed that the defendant sold to the plaintiff winter rye seed when he represented the same to be spring seed. The plaintiff says that as a result of the false representation he lost the use and benefit of his ground and he asks for judgment for \$783.75, which includes the price paid for the seed, \$54.78. Attorney I. M. Van Elten represents the plaintiff.

LONDON PAPER MAKES CHARGE AGAINST POPE

Post Declares the Vatican Has Espoused Cause of Austria in the War.

London, Nov. 22.—The Vatican is accused in an editorial in the Morning Post of being implicated in the propaganda which the newspaper says was largely responsible for the recent Italian reverses. Reviewing what it describes as vatican machinations, the Post declares that its political sophistry during the war "can by no means be regarded as consistent with the principles of neutrality."

"From the beginning," says the Post, "the vatican has leaned to Austria's side and lately has furiously, but actively, espoused the Austrian cause."

The newspaper calls on the British government to look into the matter and demands that the vatican declare definitely on which side it stands.
