



WEST POINT OPEN TO ONE MONTANA YOUTH

Some youth of Montana will have the chance next month of being appointed to the West Point Military Academy, with a commission in the United States army upon graduation.

The examination will be held in the following cities of Montana: Anaconda, Billings, Bozeman, Butte, Dillon, Glasgow, Great Falls, Hamilton, Havre, Helena, Kalispell, Lewistown, Livingston, Miles City, Missoula and Round Bay. Applicants will be examined in algebra, geometry, grammar, geography, United States history and arithmetic. The examinations will be held at the postoffices in the cities mentioned.

To be eligible for appointment young men must be between the ages of 17 and 21 and they should communicate with Senator Walsh at Washington, D. C., within the next two weeks.
