LIVESTOCK LOSS REPORTED HEAVY

The Stockmen in Colorado and Wyoming Report Unusual Losses.

The Post's Washington Bureau. Washington, D. C., Dec. 14.—According to reports which reach the United States forest service from the west, manifesting itself in a new form of diabolism which is making its appearance in that part of the country.

These reports state that cattle and sheep are being found dead on the forest ranges in unprecedented numbers and a plan is being formulated to reduce the country's beef supply is suspected.

Will C. Barnes, field agent of the forest service, who has just returned from an extensive tour of the forest ranges throughout the west, does not believe that German agents have been working in the mountains. Barnes causes the large number of deaths of cattle and sheep.

"I think the great destruction of animal life is due to poisonous weeds," he said. "When the cattle and sheep come down into the open country they eat these weeds and die."

Complaints of a reduction of the beef supply by killing off animals also have been lodged with Herbert Hoover, national food administrator, who will look into the matter.

ASKS HIM TO PAY \$50,000 FOR WIFE

Robert Scelze Thinks Lester Harvey Should Pay for Alleged Alienation.

Holding his "actual damages" at \$15,000 and asking that one Lester Harvey pay in addition \$35,000 damages as an exemplary measure, Robert C. Scelze of Sweetgrass county has filed a civil suit in the federal court, basing his suit upon the statement that Harvey illegally and wrongfully deprived him of his wife.

The case takes on the form of the "eternal triangle" in the complaint filed by Scelze. Scelze alleges that he and Lester Harvey were wed in Chicago in 1914 and that thereafter said Harvey did, "by illegal, wrongful and malicious persuasion, conversation and alienation," deprive him of his wife's companionship.

Scelze goes even further and declares that the now Mrs. Harvey obtained her divorce "before the said Lester Harvey had been a resident of the state of Montana for the period of one year, as is provided by the statutes of the state of Montana."

For all of which, Scelze alleges, through his attorneys, he should be granted actual damages of \$15,000 and that punishment should be further meted out to the said Harvey to the additional extent of \$35,000.

Harvey is a citizen of the state of Illinois.

A circular letter received from the authorities at Tulsa, Oklahoma, today by the sheriff's office offers a reward of \$5,000 for the capture of the person or persons who blew up the residence of J. Edgar Pew at Tulsa on the morning of October 29 last.
