Edward Childs Carpenter has never confessed just what suggested to him the plot of his successful comedy, "The Cinderella Man," but from what the Baconians call "inter-visual evidence" it is safe to say that

the story done into film form at the Goldwyn studio sprang from the old nursery tale and that, once the dramatic possibilities of the story had gone home, the cleverness of the inverted title clinched matters.

The story of Cinderella—perhaps we ought to say of the Cinderella girl—is easily one of the most popular tales, if not the most popular, in the whole of the world's fiction. In one form or another the pathos of the

neglected girl who is decked out in finery to win affections that would never have been given her in her humble dress and surroundings has been a staple of fiction through all time. It has appeared so frequently on the stage that one critic, George Jean Nathan, has acquired the habit of dubbing "Cinderella plays" any pieces that, like "The Marionettes," "Peg O' My Heart" and "Sari"—to name only a few—employ this old and always popular plot.

To Mr. Carpenter occurred the idea of adding to the tremendous drawing power of this story's pathos the novelty of making the hero, instead of the heroine, the victim of neglect. So he ennobled a poverty-stricken poet in an old garret, and sent across the snowy roof to him a little lady of wealth and fashion bearing Christmas cheer. Of course, she brought a great many more things before the play was out; but the chief gift was, after all, a love awakened by pity. And as Mae Marsh, the star of "The Birth of a Nation," "Polly of the Circus" and "Sunshine Alley," is visualizing the heroine, it is safe to say that charm of the situation is quite as fully developed as the pathos from which it springs.
