## GEO. CULWELL DEAD

Old Settler Passes Over the Great Divide Wednesday Morning, Dec. 30, 1908.

George W. Culwell died at the Valley Hospital in this city at 8 o'clock Wednesday morning after an illness of about a month, at the age of 53 years.

George Washington Culwell was born in Texas, Feb. 12, 1855 and came to Montana to make his home in 1888. He was a twin brother of A. J. Culwell, of the Pioneer Livery Barn of Culbertson.

Mr. Culwell was raised a Methodist, but of late years had not attended any church. Shortly before his death he sent for his brother's wife, Mrs. A. J. Culwell, who is a devout Catholic, and asked her to pray for him. From that time on he seemed a changed man, and on Tuesday of this week sent for Father P. F. Salm, Catholic Missionary at Poplar, who came to him at once and rendered the last services. He passed away calm and serene and at peace with the world.

The funeral was held from the residence of his brother, A. J. Culwell at 2 p. m. yesterday, the remains being laid to rest in Culbertson Cemetery. The services were conducted by Culbertson Aerie, F. O. E., of which Mr. Culwell was a member.

George Culwell was an old timer in Valley county and had a host of friends by whom he will be sincerely mourned.
