The Development League Recommends Attendance at State Fair and Dry Farming Congress.

WHEREAS, The Montana Development League was organized for the purpose of exploiting the tremendous natural resources of the greatest undeveloped state in the Union. It has for its president, Lieutenant Governor W. R. Allen and on its board of directors a member from each county in the state. The chairman of its advisory board is Governor E. L. Norris and this board is composed of four representative citizens from each county. Every member of the organization feels great interest in furthering any proposition that will redeem to the benefit of our great commonwealth, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That this organization heartily endorses the Seventeenth National Irrigation Congress, which is to be held in Spokane, August 9th to 14th, inclusive. This congress, we confidently believe, will be a great factor in stimulating irrigation projects throughout our state.

We commend to the people of Montana, the Montana state fair, to be held in Helena, September 27th to October 2nd, inclusive, at which place the products of the treasure state, including mine metals, manufacturing concerns, stock grading, educational institutions, ranching, the fruit industry, dairying, etc., will be exhibited. These products will be inspected by his Excellency, William Howard Taft, president of the United States, who has accepted an invitation for Tuesday, September 28th, 1909.

We also heartily endorse and commend to agriculturalists generally and those interested, directly or indirectly, in agricultural matters, the fourth annual session of the Dry Farming Congress and International Dry Farming Exposition to be held in Billings, October 26, 27, and 28. At this congress much and valuable information will be imparted to the stranger within our gates, as well as our own people.

All of the above institutions are of vital importance to our growing state. We commend them as educational factors, as a means of advertising and an incentive to exploit the undeveloped resources of a great and wealthy domain.
