And Lo! and Behold! The Almighty Saints of the village of Baker have arisen from their golden thrones and at last declared themselves. Like St. Patrick driving the snakes from Ireland these dwellers of the lake have raised their swords and are now proceeding to drive the people of southeastern Custer county from the division fight. Are we to believe that they will? No! Not if they go ahead and turn down their word of honor which they gave to the delegates at the mass meeting in Baker when they voted unanimously on the following motion, which was by the way made by Apostle Conser of Baker.

"Motion made by Conser that we declare ourselves in favor of the division of the county, on the lines running NORTH AND SOUTH, seconded by Lucas of Ekalaka."

Here is another part of the minutes of the meeting:-

"Moved by Lucas that the next meeting be held at Ekalaka on the 17th of April at 7 p. m. with full power to act as to, and concerning county division."

This motion was voted on and unanimously carried following the report of the committee on drawing up boundary lines which read: "Your committee on drawing lines have this to report:-

That we can not report upon any lines at this time, and recommend that a meeting be held on April 17th, said meeting to be composed of representation from each precinct on the ratio of one delegate for each 20 votes or fraction thereof, cast at the last election. Signed--John Oliver, R. E. Morris, Al. Davis, H. L. Brockway.

And now it is said that the Baker people have taken it upon themselves to get county division and have picked out their own territory and has left the southeastern part of the county to take care of itself. They also have said that they did not care to attend the meeting at Ekalaka this month. We are left out because they say that "Ekalaka accepted a proposition from the people of Carlyle which was turned down by the Bakerites, and that we were after Baker." In regards to this we must remark that we never have had any communications with the people of the northern part of the county and who ever started the report was telling something not true. Just what the outcome will be remains to be seen--And Ekalaka continues to grow.
