SEPTEMBER 14, 15 & 16, 1914

\$3,000 IN PRIZES AND PURSES

Grand Agricultural Display of Fallon County Farm Products

Below we give you the race program and rules:

**First Day**  
Arrangement of exhibits, ball games, wild west sports and dancing in the evening.

**Second Day**  
Ball game in the morning. Racing program as follows in the afternoon. Program to commence at 1:30 sharp.

**Event** Purse.  
2:30 Trot or Pace, best 2 in 3 heats \$250.00  
Relay Race, 1 1/2 miles, three horse, change each 1/2 mile - \$125.00

Second Heat of Trot or Pace  
1/2 mile Free-for-all Running race - \$100.00  
1/2 mile Cowboy race, saddle horse and stock saddles to be used - \$50.00

Third Heat of Trot or Pace  
1/2 mile Farmer's Race, for team and 3' wagon with box, wagons to be lined up in front of judges stand and at word "go" drivers to hitch up and start - \$50.00

1/2 mile Free-for-all for Running race \$125.00

**Third Day**  
Ball game in forenoon. Racing program at 2:00 P. M. Sharp.

**Event** Purse  
1/4 mile Free-for-all Running Race \$75.00  
Free-for-all Trot or Pace, best 3 in 5 heats - \$300.00

Second heat of Relay race  
Second heat of Trot or Pace  
Novelty Race walk 1/2 mile, trot 1/2 mile and run 1/2 mile all under saddle without change - \$75.00

Third heat of Trot or Pace  
One mile saddle horse race, stock saddles to be used, no weight required - \$75.00

Fourth heat of Trot or Pace

One mile Free-for-all running race, \$31.25 to be paid winner at each 1/4 mile - \$125.00

Consolation race, for horse not having won money in any race either day, one money, no entrance fee - \$50.00

## RACING RULES

All entries must be made with the entry clerk not later than 7 o'clock P. M. on the day previous to the day of race. 10 per cent of the purse will be charged as entrance to all races unless otherwise mentioned in the program, which fee must be paid before the closing of entries or animals entered will be barred.

All purses, unless otherwise specified will be divided 60, 30, and 10 per cent. The Relay race will commence from in front of judges stand. Harness races will be run under rules of American Trotting Ass'n and running races under American Jockey club rules.

All protests must be made before the starting of any race, to the judges and their decision as rendered shall be final.

The association will not be responsible for any injury to stock upon the grounds and no animals will be allowed to run at large. Dogs appearing upon the grounds will be shot.

All employees of the association and horsemen must obtain entrance badges before entering grounds or pay regular admission.

All purses will be paid by the Secretary at his office in Ekalaka at any time after 6 P. M. following the race and all purses not called for within 15 days shall be forfeited to the association.
