

## Oliver Sends Communication

Dear Sir:

It has just been brought to my notice that certain erroneous reports are being circulated in the northern part of Fallon County to the effect that I am now working for the interests of those people to the exclusion of the interests of my friends at Ekalaka.

I want to brand this as an absolute mis-statement. It was circulated for no other purpose than with a malicious intent. I campaigned the county of Fallon last fall on behalf of the town of Ekalaka because I believed that I was right and am just as firm in my belief today as I was then.

There is also another report being circulated to the effect that at some time within the last few weeks that I had held a conversation with Mr. Martin Flasted in which I promised to discourage my Ekalaka friends in carrying on the contest against Baker for the county seat, providing he would withdraw his contest against me, this is absolutely wrong and false, no such statement or promises were ever made nor suggested by me to Mr. Flasted or any one else. I did talk to Mr. Flasted and endeavored to show him that it was for his best political interests not to openly accuse the judges and clerks of election in the precincts where he claimed the votes had been erroneously and wrongfully counted against him and endeavored to show him that he could not prevail in the contest. I think you will agree with me

by this time that my advice to him was good and so far as making him any promises, I did nothing of the kind and to be fair to Mr. Flasted, he never even suggested such a movement.

To put the whole matter plainly before my friends, I simply desire to state this, that my position on every question which entered into our campaign last fall and every question which has grown out of the result of that campaign is just the same today as it was when we finished the campaign.
