How to Prevent Mould in Butter.

The important losses in butter through the growth of mold upon the tub lining, wrapper, or in the butter itself, which injures the salability of the product, have led the United States department of agriculture to investigate this subject. Mold in butter is usually found in three forms. (1) Orange-yellow areas with some growth of mycelium under the surface. (2) Smudge or dirty green area, either entirely inside the butter or with some surface growth. (3) Green-surface colonies, either upon the butter, causing decomposition, or upon the container or wrappings which will injure the appearance of the butter.

Experiments in producing molds artificially in samples of butter indicate that a growth of mold in or about butter is favored by excessive curd, by "leaky" butter or by wet surfaces, wet wrappings or highly moist air. If butter molds readily it is an indication of insufficient salting, as salt up to 2.5 to 3 per cent is sufficient to prevent mold or reduce it to a negligible amount. The growth of molds moreover, is largely reduced by keeping the butter at low temperatures. Improper storage temperatures, accompanied as they frequently are with moist conditions, are favorable to mold butter. Unsalted butter is more subject to deterioration from microorganisms than salted butter. Successful storage of such butter is therefore dependent upon scrupulously clean, dry refrigeration. Cellars and ice refrigeration rarely furnish conditions which will prevent mold in unsalted or slightly salted butter, although it may be delayed or reduced. Butter properly made and normally salted (up to 2.5 to 3 per cent, equivalent to the use of a 12 to 15 per cent brine) will not show mold under reasonably careful handling.

Investigators in summarizing their results emphasize the fact that well-washed butter is less subject to mold than that with an excess of curd, but the essential factor in molding seems to be, water, not protein. "Leaky" butter from which milky water exudes and collects in the wrapper or container furnishes the best condition for the beginning of mold growth. From these wet areas colonies may spread to the butter itself. Mold, the investigators find, will not grow upon the surface of a piece of butter exposed to air at ordinary humidities. The water in the butter is not sufficiently available to the mold to support the development of a colony unless evaporation is reduced by a high-moisture content of the surrounding air. In closed packages, wet or damp cellars, or carelessly packed masses with cracks or fissures in which moisture collects, mold may seriously injure the appearance of the packages or actually induce great changes in the butter itself.

Green molds may damage normally salted butter if cracks and open spaces are left by bad packing. Other investigators have found that paraffining the tubs or boxes prevents mold on the container and the liner by preventing the escape of water which would leave the air space necessary for mold growth.

Very moderate salting prevents the appearance of the orange-yellow patches and the smudges. The green molds affect normally salted butter only when it is held under conditions of temperature or moisture that are favorable to mold growth.

Railway earnings are working up better, and January reports, taken collectively, are likely to present a more pleasing view.

Canal Shows Increase.

Notwithstanding expectations to the contrary, both tolls and tonnage of the Panama canal for January showed an increase over any previous month since the canal was opened for traffic on August 15 last. During January the canal earned \$419,937 in tolls, derived from a total canal tonnage of 448,957. The total tonnage is only a little more than that for November, the previous high month. The totals are \$7,141 in excess of those for December, the previous high month for receipts.

Since the canal opened on August 15 it has earned \$1,966,137 in tolls. The total tonnage for the period from August 15 to February 1 was 2,192,856, which was carried in 454 vessels of all descriptions. In January, 98 ships passed through the waterway, of which six did not carry cargoes of any kind. The number of vessels for the month was one below December.

An analysis of the canal traffic indicates that the United States coastwise shipping continues to make the largest share of canal tolls payments, although that to the United States and Europe from South American west coast ports is increasing rapidly.

Traffic from the United States to the far east is making slower headway than either of the other two large trade routes through the canal.

The decline of one branch of the fishing industry in this country is indicated in the announcement from New Bedford, Mass., of the suspension of the Whalemens' Shipping List.

When the paper was established in 1843 the number of vessels engaged in the whale fishery was 675, with an aggregate tonnage of 119,174. Three years later high water mark in the industry was reached with 680 ships aggregating 233,258 tons. Today only 32 vessels, with a total tonnage of 6,613, are occupied in the search for whales. In 1851 the whaling fleet brought to this country 428,074 barrels of sperm and whale oil and 5,652,300 pounds of whalebone. In 1914, with the pursuit of whales almost wholly confined to the Atlantic ocean, the oil brought home amounted to but 19,270 barrels. Three vessels brought back from the Arctic 34,000 pounds of whalebone. The highest price for sperm oil, reached during the civil war, was \$2.75 a gallon; last year's product sold at 45 to 48 cents.
