The 1916 campaign is but a few months away and it takes no prophetic vision to foresee the most spectacular fight here in Montana in the history of the state that has had many thrilling ones, from the days of Clark, Hinze and Daley down to the Walsh-Conrad legislative battle and the three-cornered rumpus of the last campaign, with Joe Dixon pushed up into the national arena—a matador in the bull moose corral, shouting for Armageddon, social justice and some other abstract fulminations.

But the campaign in Montana next year is sure to beat every other past performance. There will be injected into next year's political program two novelties—the women of the state voting for the first time and the question of prohibition for the state as a major issue. The question of prohibition is intensely a moral one and will come home to every community in the state with keen directness. Thousands of new arrivals in the state who never cast a ballot here before and the thousands of women votes added to the poll book will produce a condition that is bound to utterly baffle the trained political prognosticators and everyone will be guessing wildly as to the outcome of all issues, big and small.

There will be two primary elections and a general election, so after the campaign begins there will be no letup to the excitement. Aside from the temperance question the issues are still somewhat hazy. But no one need fear a paucity of issues. The national election will take care of that. But with the women enfranchised and temperance a paramount issue at least two aspects of the campaign will be replete with absorbing interest.
