Mary Stuart, the dean at the University of Montana, received a hearty welcome at headquarters Thursday afternoon. Miss Stewart has just been on a tour throughout the state and spoke Wednesday evening to the Carpenter Union in Great Falls. She also spoke at Ravalli where an enthusiastic audience was gathered, similar audience in St. Ignatius. Miss Stewart is one of the wittiest, original and logical speakers on the Montana platform to-day. If she speaks this week in Helena the people who hear her will be accorded a rare treat.

It is necessary to give notice that there is absolutely no more available copies of the Suffrage News. There has been many inquiries for the first edition but in every case there were none to be secured after the first day. There were 600 copies printed the first day, 1000 the second and by Thursday the demand was so great that 2,000 were printed. It was thought to be a somewhat difficult attempt to start the paper. Now it looks as though it would be still more difficult to stop it.

Thursday noon a seven passenger car drew up at headquarters. It was loaded with suffragists who had made the trip overland from Butte. They were Mr. and Mrs. C. P. Irish and little daughter, Betty; Mrs. J. R. E. Solvers, Mrs. Grace Rabbitt and son. The big auto, decorated for the occasion will serve as the reviewing stand for Governor Stewart and Mayor Working before whom the big parade will pass.

Mrs. L. F. Higgins of Deer Lodge came in on Thursday in time to register for her part in the suffrage parade. Mrs. Higgins has accomplished much for the educational work of her little city and is a valued worker in the suffrage ranks.

Mrs. G. M. Gilmore as a worker at the Suffrage booth Thursday. Mrs. Gilmore comes from Glendive, where she is kept busy looking after a large ranch, a business in town, and the many details of the suffrage campaign.

Mrs. C. H. Eaton, a voter from California, registered at headquarters this morning and will represent a white state in the parade.

Another car came all the way from Butte to take part in the parade. It was driven by Mr. Willis Ellis and the passengers consisted of his wife, his mother, Mrs. J. B. Ellis, and Mrs. E. B. Clinch. The car will represent the Montana Equal Franchise League and the chrysanthemums will furnish the major part of the decorative scheme.

Once upon a time, not a thousand miles from Helena, it occurred to some Anti suffragists to make some men of straw and set them up as an example and warning and label them. "Men who vote for equal suffrage." So a representative held herself to a nearby vendor in such material and asked for the straw. "How much do you want?" courteously asked the man. The lady explained that she wanted some to stuff some straw men to represent the men who voted for suffrage. "Well," said the man, "you have come to the wrong place. You would need such a lot of straw to make them all that I really wouldn't want to take the contract for supplying you."

Mrs. Maggie Smith Hathway reported at headquarters Thursday morning. Mrs. Hathway is the whirlwind suffrage orator. She has travelled 1284 miles in the state of Montana since June 5 and has talked to more people than a great many other speakers combined. She will be a valuable addition to the suffrage workers.

The enterprising little Chinook worker, Mrs. John C. Duff, arrived at headquarters and was soon busy assembling the delegates from her section.

Mrs. J. A. Kelly acting chairman of Rosebud County, came in Thursday prepared to marshal her forces for the big day.
