LOCALS

From Great Falls came a complete representation of the local suffrage organization. President, Mrs. J. H. Chase; vice president, Mrs. J. H. King; secretary, Mrs. J. E. Teague; delegate, Mrs. B. F. Chedellquist.

The College of Montana at Deer Lodge was splendidly represented in the suffrage parade by five members of the faculty and three students, and Mrs. W. I. Higgins, chairman of the advisory board. The members of the faculty are Miss Ahlin Degeler, dean of women; Miss Elizabeth M. Schyn, teacher of music; Miss Helen J. Coates, violin; Miss Jessie L. Fleming, voice; Miss Arminia Mowre, oratory. Miss Degeler and Miss Coates carried the College Equal Suffrage Club banner and Miss Fleming and Miss Schyn carried the largest banner in the procession—a huge affair which says: "We demand an amendment to the constitution of the United States enfranchising women." This banner was presented to the Montana association by the women of Washington, and by request of the state chairman these young ladies had the honor of bearing it. Mrs. Higgins and Miss Mowre will carry the Powell county banner.

Mrs. George Robertson, precinct leader of the club at Sixteen came to the capital city to represent the club in the big parade. She is accompanied by Mrs. Morris.

Mrs. Grace Cotterill of Seattle, who has been touring Montana in the interest of suffrage, arrived at headquarters in time to help in the parade. Mrs. Cotterill has just returned from Fort Benton, where she had one of the most successful meetings ever held in the state. She was introduced by the mayor and autos were drawn up in line for a block. Both the papers in that bustling town are supporters of the movement and gave very encouraging reports of Mrs. Cotterill's work in that part of the state.

Miss Mary Halliday of White Sulphur Springs, one of the pioneer and most enthusiastic suffrage workers in Montana, came to the city Thursday evening to hear Dr. Anna Shaw. Miss Halliday listened to Dr. Shaw when she spoke on suffrage twenty years ago in Denver. Miss Halliday is accompanied by Mrs. Knapp of the enfranchised state of Washington.

The local Clerks' Union No. 67 of Great Falls will be represented in the parade by three delegates—Misses Ruby Healy, Katherine McLean and Nettie Willburg. They will bear the banner, "Workingmen, Eight Million Working Women Need Your Votes."

Livingston sent a delegation worthy of special mention to the fair for Woman's day. They were Mesdames Elbert Allen, S. O. N. C. Brady, F. C. De Groat, Andrew Seaberg, F. J. Jackson, H. A. James, H. F. Stange, W. C. Bradford, J. F. Mercer, Mr. and Mrs. L. D. Gardner, Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Korhl and Rev. Gardner. Marshaled by Mrs. William Tocher, county chairman of Park county, these marchers will bear sheaves of wheat in the big parade to show to the world some of the prize winning products of that famous county.

Seven young ladies accompanied Mrs. Helen Fitzgerald Sanders from Butte Friday morning. They will all take part in the parade, and Mrs. Sanders is busy getting representatives of the Blackfeet Indians to march in her particular section.

Two extremely valuable additions to the marchers arrived in the city Friday morning. They were Mrs. Anton Obermeyer and Mrs. H. Solholm. They will act as buglers for the parade, as both are accomplished cornetists. Mrs. Obermeyer was accompanied by her two little boys, Earl and Roland.


Mrs. Margaret P. Griffin of Dozeman, editor of the home department of the Montana Farmer, dropped into headquarters this week. Mrs. Griffin was attending to the girls' jelly and

jam contest, which she inaugurated this year at the state fair. The small girls of the state made jellies and jams from the native wild fruits and competed for prizes offered by Mr. H. W. Child. The exhibit of these products was one of the features of the industrial contests of the fair.

Mrs. W. I. Higgins, chairman of Powell county, who has been a suffragist for a few years only, says she has a certain sympathy for those opposed to "Votes for Women," for the majority of these women are prejudiced against some of the overzealous or less tactful suffrage workers and they have lost sight of the great cause. Mrs. Higgins says that when she began the study of the question she was convinced almost against her will that women should vote—that it is just and right. She attended anti-suffrage meetings in Michigan, Ohio, Kentucky and Massachusetts and gave the question conscientious thought. She is always proud that her husband persuaded her to help in the work in Montana, although she would rather have remained in the background.
