Three thousand five hundred and sixty sheep sheared 24,-896, which is an average of 7 pounds per head. This is beyond an average shearing, and we don't think any of our sheep growers can show up as big a one here.

New coal mines have been discovered on the Missouri below Belt creek. Professor Cope, U.S. geologist, who visited this section in 1876, stated that the whole country from the mouth of Sun river to Buford and from the Yellowstone to the Boundary Line was underlaid with coal.
