FIRST ELECTION RETURNS.

HOPEFUL FOR REPUBLICANS. New York, Ohio, town, New Jersey, Maryland, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania and Utah Going Republican—The Democrats Carry Virginia, and Kentucky is in the Doubtful Column—A Republican Will Succeed Here in the U. S. Senate.

New York City, Nov. 5.—New York state has gone republican by at least 75,000. The chairman of the republican state central committee claims over 100,000.

Trenton, N.J.—From present indications the republicans have carried the state. Columbus, Ohio.—Governor-Elect Asa Bushnell will have at least 80,000 plurality over Campbell.

Boston, Mass.—From present returns received Governor Greenhalge will lead his democratic opponent, Williams, about two to one. Des Moines, Ia.—The weather seems good all over the state.

Pittsburg, Pa.—Fine weather is bringing out a larger vote than was expected. Magee, democratic candidate for superior judge, is running ahead of the ticket.

Louisville, Ky.—Both sides are strenuously claiming victory. The Courier-Journal claims the election of Hardin, democrat, for governor by a small plurality.

Minister Terrill has succeeded in moving the Turkish government to punish the men who murdered the bicyclist, Lenz, in Armenia. He has cabled the state department that the Kurds and Armenians, who committed the murder, are to be tried at Erzeroum.

In Leslie county, Ky., on Wednesday night, the Hon. W. P. Bentley, who was a member of the Kentucky legislature during 1887-88, fought a duel to the death with Elgo Higgin, a man of very bad reputation.

The king of Ashanti has declined to accept the ultimatum of the British government, which provides for a British commander in his country. He declared that he would fight first, and is prepared to do so.

The trial of Theodore Durrant for the murder of Blanche Lamont, at San Francisco, resulted in a verdict of guilty on the first ballot. The jury were only out twenty minutes.

Hubert George Lyulph Howard, second son of the Earl of Carlisle, has succeeded in joining the insurgent army, and is now a captain under General Antonio Maceo.
