
The New President.

THE United States has a new president, William Howard Taft. Yesterday on a large platform in front of the capitol, at Washington, amidst crowds thronging the colonnades and porticoes and even clinging to the housetops, president Roosevelt gave away to the brilliant son of Ohio.

In general training and in administrative experience Mr. Taft is better equipped for the Presidency than any who has been inaugurated within fifty years. All his life has been spent in public service, but never at his seeking. He has performed service in almost every department of our government. He has been prosecuting attorney, solicitor-general, judge of the Superior Court, of Ohio, Judge of the United States Circuit Court. He has been commissioner to Cuba, governor of the Philippines and Secretary of the Navy. All of his public positions required wide knowledge, clear judgement, firmness, discretion and tact and yet he has filled them all with a success that at once inspires confidence and admiration. He understands the conditions and wants of our foreign possessions, by his recent travels throughout the republic he has come in close contact with the people, by his service in the executive department, he has become acquainted with the work of the executive, by his work as judge he has acquired a systematic mind that weighs, considers and arranges for a logical conclusion. If Taft is Roosevelt's creature, so much more credit to the political sagacity of Roosevelt for picking a man so eminently qualified, and so different in many respects from the strenuous president himself.

If Roosevelt's character was to be described in one word, that word would probably be, "energy." If we were to characterize Taft in a similar manner we would probably use the term, "Good nature." He is a human radiator of happiness and good cheer. But he is also something more, he is a doer of things, a builder, for he has accomplished results that are memorable. In this respect he is the superior of Roosevelt, for he does not ruffle the hair of his colleagues or make a fuss in accomplishing his end. He proceeds in a calm, careful, kindly manner. His will be a peaceful administration, but full of successful achievement.

Many believe the rule of the corporations will now begin, but to those who know Judge Taft, to those who have heard him and spoken to him, the impression is otherwise. He too like Roosevelt is a forceful man, he has never yet in his public career so

far faltered before a public duty. He is not ambitious, on the contrary the office has always sought him, because he was fitted for it and because his past record shows that he believes honor is more to be desired than any temporary material gain, you may have through its sacrifice. May God bless our new president as he takes up his difficult task.

The investigation as to the cause of the recent crib disaster in the lake at Chicago, by which sixty people lost their lives, is ended and, as was freely predicted, no one was blamed for the disaster. The jury, however, made a number of criticisms, and also some recommendations, which, if carried out, will probably ensure greater protection for the workmen.
