

ORDINANCE NO. 26.

An ordinance relating to dance houses and Hurdy-Gurdy houses. Be it ordained by the board of Aldermen of the town of Harlowton.

Sec. 1 That on and after the passage of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person or persons within the town of Harlowton to conduct, establish, keep, manage or maintain, any dance house or any place in which wines, beer or other liquors are sold by women, or any place of like character where lewd, dissolute or boisterous persons or public prostitutes are allowed to congregate for the purpose of dancing, holding, keeping or attending dances, or to conduct, control, keep, manage or be in any manner connected with any dance house or hurdy-gurdy or hurdy house, in which spirituous wines or malt liquors are kept or sold, or any such house or place run in connection with any saloon or bar, where such liquors are sold.

Sec. 2 Any person convicted of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined in any sum not exceeding One Hundred dollars, and every day that any such house or place is kept or run in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be a separate and distinct offense.

ORDINANCE NO. 25

An ordinance licensing Merry-go-rounds: Be it ordained by the board of aldermen of the town of Harlowton.

Sec. 1 That any person or persons, association or corporation operating a merry-go-round within the town limits of the town of Harlowton shall pay a license therefore of two dollars per day or ten dollars per month.

Sec. 2 Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not to exceed Twenty-five dollars.

Sec. 3 This ordinance to be in force and effect from and after its passage and approved by the Mayor. Passed and approved this 16th day July 1909.

FIRST SCHOOL FAIR

In Montana to be held September the 2nd at Huntley--Will Prove Big Success.

An interesting educational movement has been placed on foot on the Huntley Irrigation Project, which will tend to strengthen the rural school system, not only in that community but eventually of the entire country of Yellowstone as well.

The one hundred and fifty or more pupils of the Huntley Project school are enthusiastically preparing to hold a school fair on September 2nd of this year, and as many small gardens and plots which they call "school gardens" are being weeded, hoed, irrigated and anxiously watched by them from day to day. A number of girls are practicing cake, bread and biscuit baking so as to be proficient before the day of the school fair, when they will make the supreme effort and turn in their master pieces for exhibition. Much needle work is also being done and it is not altogether in the line of fancy work, as premiums are offered on such practical exhibits as hemstitched towels, pillow cases, darning and making buttonholes. The boys who are deft with plane, saw, and chisel are making articles of furniture such as book cases, chairs and repair pieces for farm tools, implements, ect.

Nor are flowers neglected, and premiums are offered for display of annual flowers grown by pupils. And by the way, one condition which governs all awards is that the article exhibited must be the product of the pupil's own efforts.

On the stated day the results of the season's labor and attention will be brought to Huntley and properly displayed in a suitable hall. Cash premiums of moderate size are offered as an encouragement and a lively competition is anticipated. The people of the district and state will be invited to attend and witness the skill of the bright farm boys and girls attending the Huntley Project School.

The youngsters are wide awake to possibilities of this new institution and the school gardens show everything from radishes to water melons, and from sugar corn to zinnias.

Work of this character has a distinct educational value and this fact is being recognized more from day to day. It is slowly becoming part of the educational system in a number of States and by several is being supported by liberal appropriations.

Scholarship of pupils is improved and ambition stimulated. During the fair the children of the entire community will mingle together in social intercourse and enlarge the circle of their acquaintance far beyond the bounds of their local school district. They learn to judge quality of farm and garden products and acquire a keen appreciation of matters pertaining to the farm home.
