

No Boom Is Desired.
Again it might be reiterated that Montana does not want a single settler who is not able to make a living upon the lands of the state and it is not inviting the investment of a single dollar unless it can be plainly seen that the investment is upon a sound business basis and promises ample remuneration. Montana does not want a land boom or any other sort of a boom, and patriotic and farsighted citizens of the Treasure State will do everything within their power to discourage everything that savors of boom methods.
There is not within the confines of this great republic a region which offers better inducements to the homeseeker and investor than does Montana. Here we have the land that will produce the greatest crops; here we have the commonwealth of practically limitless resources which require development. Here also, it is now apparent seems to be a field for the operation of that conscienceless class known as "boomers and promoters."
The man who seriously considers locating upon the lands of Montana, should before he decides upon a step that is always momentous, come out and look the country over, or if any number of people in a community are talking of Montana and the inducements to settlers which it offers, it might be wise for them to send one of their number here to investigate conditions and the possibilities for the making of homes upon the lands of the great Northwest.
Montana cannot afford to be the tool in the hands of boomers and promoters. She knows that she offers to the world boundless opportunities for intelligent people, and she can show to these that she "is there with the goods." For this reason, Montana invites investigations. Let the homeseeker or the investor look into the matters and let him go about the matter in a businesslike manner. He may find that in some sections, things have been misrepresented, or at least misunderstood, while in others he will find exactly what he wishes.
Just because there are fertile lands and thriving industries may not be a sign that all lands are fertile or all industries prosperous. The man who falls victim to the boomer or the promoter has only himself to blame if he meets with disaster, for it would cost little to investigate, and it is certain that Montana has nothing to lose through a investigation.—Billings Gazette.
