ORDINANCE NUMBER 28.

Ordinance Relating to the Establishment of a curfew hour, and providing for Ringing of the Bell for the Same.

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Harlowton, Meagher County, Montana:

Sec. I. That the hour of Nine (9) o'clock p. m. of each day be the hour of curfew within the limits of the Town of Harlowton.

Sec. II. That it shall be the duty of the town marshal on each and every night to give warning of said hour of curfew by ringing the fire bell of said Town of Harlowton, in a slow manner, at the hour of Nine (9) o'clock p. m.

Sec. III. It shall be the duty of each and every child, unless accompanied by parent or guardian, to leave and abandon the streets, stores or other public buildings within the Town of Harlowton, and any child under the age of 17 not accompanied by parent or guardian, who neglects, delays to leave and abandon said street or public buildings, or disobeys the Town Marshal after being warned that the curfew hour has passed, shall upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine not less than \$1.00 and to exceed \$25.00.

Sec. IV. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage and approval.
