

## MEETING WITH GREAT SUCCESS

### Republicans Create Scenes of Political Enthusiasm Wherever They Hold Meetings--Large Crowds Turn Out.

The opera house at Twodot was the scene Tuesday night of a big enthusiastic republican rally, at which local men were the principal orators. Nearly 150 people crowded into the hall. E. C. Baxter presided over the meeting.

#### Interesting Addresses.

The speakers Attorney W. C. Husband of Harlowton, Frank S. Webster of Shawmut, the republican candidate for county commissioner, and James H. Lackey of Judith Gap, republican candidate for sheriff, were well received. Their addresses covered a comprehensive array of topics, and were often interrupted by a hearty applause. W. C. Husband gave a very forceful address. He confined himself entirely to national affairs. Frank S. Webster treated the people with a most impressive political speech, touching both on national and local politics. James H. Lackey, who is one of the best orators in this county, pleased the gathering with a good "straight from the shoulder" talk. He touched mostly on local conditions.

#### Big Meetings at Martinsdale and Lennep.

Republican rallies were held at Martinsdale and Lennep Wednesday and Thursday night of this week, which proved a large success, many people being present at both meetings. Mayor A. T. Anderson, Frank S. Webster and James H. Lackey were the speakers. These men, as usual, delivered most splendid and interesting addresses on the campaign issues.

Taking it all in all the conditions for a sweeping victory in Meagher County for the republicans are very favorable.

#### A. W. Criss.

A. W. Criss, independent candidate for county surveyor of Meagher county, was in the city Tuesday calling on the voters. Mr. Criss has been employed on the surveying corps of the Milwaukee railroad for sometime, but lately severed his connection with that road and started in business for himself in Harlowton. He reports that a new town to be known as Durand City has recently been platted. It is located near the old town of Copperopolis in Meagher county which was an important mining camp years ago. The new town has been located on the proposed new line of the Northern Pacific railroad from Judith Gap to White Sulphur Springs and Helena, and when that road is completed the old mines at Copperopolis will be reopened and worked to their fullest capacity. Platting the new townsite was the last surveying Mr. Criss did.--Judith Gap Journal.

#### A Big Land Deal.

We are informed by J. I. Donald of Hedgesville, that Clare Wellington of the Winnecook Land & Live Stock Co. spent two days last week at the Rothiemay ranch of Geo. Pirrie, and that this portends a probable large land deal either in the way of a purchase or by amalgamation of those two large farm and stock ranches. The ranches in question are among the largest holdings now left in any part of Montana and comprises some of the finest lands in the state with very valuable water rights attached to both ranches.--Hedges Herald.

### Work Will Commence on Water Works at Once--Alderman Hash Resigns.

The city council met in regular session last Monday night in the Urner Hotel, and much business was disposed.

Lee Hash, alderman from the second ward, resigned on account of having established his residence on his homestead north of town, and Henry Weber was appointed by Mayor Anderson to take his place.

The council ordered the street and alley committee to see that sidewalks are built from Central Avenue up to the new school building, and that cross walks are put in on the E. F. Ross corner and Weber corner on Central Avenue.

Otto Washmusdorf a civil engineer from Lewistown, has been secured by the city to act as consulting engineer during the construction of the city water works, and to draw plans and specifications. Bids for the installing of the water works system will be advertised for within the next few weeks and work on same will be pushed as rapidly as possible.
