"This ballot should be marked with an "X" in the square before the name of each person or candidate for whom the elector intends to vote. In cases of a ballot containing a Constitutional Amendment, or other Question to be submitted to a vote of the people by marking an "X" in the square before the answer of the Question or Amendment submitted. The elector may write in the blank spaces, or paste over another name, or name of any person for whom he wishes to vote, and vote for such person by marking an "X" in the square before such name.
