THE WEEK HOW WILL WHEAT GO? EUROPE'S CREDIT GROWS WORSE SIR OLIVER LODGE HERE PERSHING URGES REGARD FOR LAW

POLITICAL COSTUMERS Will wheat prices drop when the government guarantee is removed on June 1? While a prophecy on this matter might be dangerous, it might not be out of place to note some facts of the case.

Our markets have become so artificial, so little the result of supply and demand within certain limits, that the wheat which the grain combine now holds is a strong factor against price reduction.

Probably the most important factor is the way next year's market is diagnosed. If the price is going to be forced down by a bumper crop in early farmers could not afford to hold.

Our winter wheat acreage has been cut 12,000,000 acres, not to mention winter losses. Spring wheat acreage is due for a considerable cut.

All the news from Europe gives evidence of increasing alarm over the money and banking situation. Alarm there gives rise to excitement here.

In a short time a great international conference of bankers and government agents will be held to find a way out of disaster.

Banks and other fiduciary institutions, as well as the large capitalists, are loaded with this paper, which has no value when it has no income.

Neither of our parties dares to go into the next election with a program for large loans to Europe on its shoulders.

A visit by Sir Oliver Lodge, the foremost advocate of what is known as spiritualism, to the United States has awakened considerable discussion of the subject here.

General Pershing is among the large number of persons in liberal and progressive groups who have said a good word in favor of law and order and consequently a strong word against those who would resort to mob violence.

"I believe that former service men, through their organizations, should stand firmly behind the government in its efforts to protect law and order."
