The Immigration During 1906 Was 216,000.

While it is well to heed every word of caution from the leaders in commerce and finance and to avoid all speculative ventures that lack a solid business foundation, it is clearly evident that there is no conspicuous weak spot in Canada's present era of prosperity. The Toronto Globe says: "The Dominion has in a commercial sense plenty of money, and our leading financial institutions are in a position to lend freely in the United States. The chief productive enterprises of Canada are not buoyed up by an era of dangerous speculation, but are following substantial business methods and finding safe and continuous markets for their goods. We are not bolstering up any industries by extensive export bonuses that must impoverish the people as a whole, and ultimately lead to collapse through the failure of the artificial aid. There is no extreme protection in Canada such as would create great fortunes for a few at the expense of the general public and lead to disruption and catastrophe. The prosperity of Canada has no artificial foundation being based on a healthy and substantial expansion of trade and industry, with a proportionate extension of productive settlement to new areas."

Our timber wealth can be made continuous by a judicious policy. And agriculture, the real foundation of our prosperity, is expanding with every new expenditure on railway construction. We are not in the flush of a railway mania that could bring its punishment through the useless duplication of lines. The gigantic railway enterprises that now stimulate every line of business in Canada will create a new Dominion, and thus render easy the heavy burdens of debt now freely assumed. Canada's era of prosperity has been unprecedented, but there is no sign of weakness and no cause for lack of confidence. While our growth is normal and healthy, we need have no alarm at its rapidity. The past calendar year has given to Canada by importation an addition of 216,000 to its population. Of this the United States contributed 63,781. **MONTANA NEWS**

**FINDS MILLIONS; NOW POOR.**

Discoverer of Alder Gulch Is Ill and Poor.

Illustrative of the ups and downs that come to those who seek the pot of gold supposed to lie at the end of the rainbow is Barney Hughes, the discoverer of Alder gulch and the man who first put Montana among the heavy gold-producing states. The old prospector, more than seventy years old, broken and feeble by the many hardships he has undergone, now is lying in a hospital at Butte with but slight chance of ever again shouldering the prospector's pick and shovel and tramping the gulches in search of pay dirt.

Hughes panned the first pay dirt in Alder gulch, from which more than \$50,000,000 in gold was taken to add to the wealth of the world. Hughes had one of the best claims in the gulch and took out wealth in a golden stream. But the money would not stick to his fingers, and to-day, in the evening of his life, he is in dire poverty.

For many years Hughes prospected in the hills and canyons of Montana and never seemed to tire in his search for the end of the rainbow and the illusive pot of gold. Occasionally, as at Alder gulch, he has struck it rich, but while others have profited by his discoveries they have done him but little good.

During the forty years of his prospecting he always has been cheerful and optimistic. There is scarcely a section of Southern Montana and Northern Idaho where he has not made his camp. He has toiled unceasingly and always with the buoyant hope that some day he would uncover a second Alder gulch and, profiting by his experiences in the past, save enough out of his fortune to place him in affluence for the rest of his days.

**HAS NO EMINENT DOMAIN.**

Former Corporation's Powers Are Limited in Montana.

A decision of far-reaching importance was handed down by the supreme court when it held that neither by the constitution nor the laws of the state is a foreign corporation authorized to exercise the right of eminent domain.

The Helena Power Transmission company, organized under the laws of New Jersey, brought suit to condemn the lands belonging to A. N. Spratt, which are now submerged by the waters backed up by the company's dam across the Missouri. The suit was decided in favor of the company and Spratt appealed, winning the case recently. The court holds that the lands were wanted for a public use, but the company had no right to condemn them.

The court says the decision is only applicable to foreign corporations of the respondent's character, the question not being considered with reference to any other class or character.

**PLANT TO COST \$300,000.**

Billings Water Project Is Feasible, Says Engineer.

The Billings city council has received the report of A. J. Wiley, the government engineer who was employed to make a thorough investigation of the proposed plan of furnishing the municipality with its water supply. The proposition contemplates tapping the Yellowstone river at a point three miles west of the city with a canal 150 feet wide and carrying seven feet of water. The supply will be pumped from a plant south of the city to an immense reservoir in the hills 160 feet above the level of the town, and will be conveyed to the city by means of gravity.

The report, which is rather elaborate, shows that the plan is a feasible one and that it can be put into operation for approximately \$300,000.

**SLEUTHS TO CATCH RUSTLERS.**

Cattlemen's Bounty Fund to Pay Detectives.

"Rustlers" having become so numerous and so troublesome as to threaten the existence of the live stock industry, cattle raisers of Western Wyoming have had under consideration the proposition of discontinuing private bounties now paid for predatory animals and applying the fund to the employment of detectives to run down and bring to speedy justice all cattle "rustlers" and to make rustling an occupation too dangerous to be attractive.

**Cannon's "Nephew" Hobo.**

George Cannon, who claims that he is a nephew of Hon. Joseph G. Cannon, speaker of the national house of representatives, has been sentenced in the police court at Butte to five days in jail on a charge of vagrancy.

**STOCK LOSSES HEAVY.**

Reports Indicate That Weather Has Killed Many Cattle.

Reports of stock losses along the Dawson county line are coming in to Lewiston thick and fast, and the indications are that they will be heavy. Practically all of the large outfits in Fergus county report unusually heavy losses and state that unless the weather soon moderates many herds will probably be decimated.
