### TELEGRAPHIC NOTES.

The wheat yield in Oregon this year will only be 70 per cent of last year's crop. Cause, frost in Willamette valley, succeeded by very dry weather.

At Washington, D. C., on Tuesday a man claiming to be a water inspector gained admission to a house and finding a young lady alone choked and ravished her, leaving her well nigh dead.

The New Hampshire republicans cannot manage to agree upon a Senator and are about to postpone the election till 1885, thus allowing the governor of the state to fill the vacancy by appointment.

Tuesday morning two men attacked Bridget Fox, an eccentric old maid of Burlington, Iowa, in her yard, knocked her down, and took from her clothing, where it was secreted, fifteen hundred dollars and escaped. She is a miser and in the habit of carrying large sums of money about her.

The President approved the sentence of dismissal in the case of Lieut. Holmes, of the Thirtieth Infantry, recently tried by court martial at Fort Bliss, Texas, for duplicating his pay accounts. The order dismissing him from the service was issued yesterday.

LEARNED, Kans., July 17.—Walter Brown, of Kansas City, representing heavy capitalists, made the largest entry of public lands ever made in this state—43,000 acres at one dollar per acre—in the counties of Clark and Commanchie, known as the Cherokee strip. They will fence the land. It is well watered and will carry cattle the year through without feed.
