BUYING SALTPEETER IN 1861.

How La Motte Dupont Supplied the Powder for the Civil War. On the banks of the Brandywine, in Delaware, are the great Dupont Powder Mills. Established in 1802 by the French Royalist, Eleuthere T. Dupont de Nemours, who found Republican France an ungenial home, they have grown to be the greatest mills in the world for the making of explosives. At the time of the Civil War the Duponts were, as they are today, powder makers for the United States Government. In 1861 the Secretary of War sent for the Duponts, and La Motte Dupont, one of the heads of the firm, went to Washington in reply to the summons.

"Are you prepared to furnish a very large amount of gunpowder?" asked the Secretary of War. "That depends on our obtaining saltpeeter," was the answer. "The saltpeeter of the day is sold in India, of course, under the control of the British Government, and the markets are in London and Liverpool." "The Secretary of War was startled. If England should prove unfriendly during the course of the war which was opening, the saltpeeter market would, of course, be closed to the United States. "The Government," he said, "will buy a large amount at once." "Excuse me," said Mr. Dupont; "the United States cannot go into the market for saltpeeter at any reasonable price—indeed, it might not be able to buy it at all, but the Duponts can get it without exciting complaint."
