WON BY BLUE AND GREY

Richmond College No Match for the Georgetown Football Team.

Beaten by the Score of 84 to 0—Outplayed at Every Point—Varsity Players Resort to the Penalties—Tactics and Show Marked Improvement—Details of the Game.

Georgetown's game with Richmond College at Georgetown Field yesterday afternoon was easier for the former than a practice line-up with the scrubs, and the score was much higher in the varsity's favor than they could hope to run up against their hasty understudies.

The Pennsylvania system of play was used throughout the game, the guards being called back or over on nearly every play. This formation was a complete mystery to Richmond.

Coach Bull and Captain Devlin went to Philadelphia and witnessed the Chicago-Pennsylvania game last Saturday. Evidently they picked up some valuable pointers for Georgetown yesterday displayed better team work than ever before.

There was a good sized crowd, composed largely of Georgetown students, at the game. Richmond won the toss and chose to defend the south goal.

In the remaining time of the half four more touchdowns were made, and one goal kicked. Kearns, Barry, Devlin, and Riley each crossing the goal line after long runs behind good interference. Score at end of first half, 43 to 0.

In the second half 41 points more were added to Georgetown's score. Every time

that Richmond would kick off, the ball would be returned from twenty to thirty yards, and then Devlin would punt well into the end zone. Richmond backs seldom caught the ball, and when they did they failed to make returns.

In this manner the ball would be put within striking distance. Georgetown would call the guards back on nearly every play, and the backs, protected by good interference, would plunge through the line or circle the ends for long gains and finally a touchdown.

SPORT FOR THE GUNNERS

The Bird Hunting Season Opens Today.

Many District Nimrods Prepared to Invasade Surrounding Fields and Forests—Kinds of Game That May Be Bagged—Circular Issued by the Department of Agriculture.

Today will witness the first exodus of the mighty Nimrods of this city into the wilds and forests of the surrounding country, in quest of such birds as are lawful game since the stroke of midnight.

Sporting enthusiasts, whose names are legion in this city, have been furnishing up guns and ammunition since the first of the feathers, and they have announced their arrival in the neighborhood on their way to Southern winter resorts.

Within the District of Columbia the 1st of November suspends the law against the killing of ruffed grouse or pheasant, of wild turkey and quail or partridge. The whirr of the quail is not so frequent a note within the precincts of the District line that the hunter will be indifferent to its call.

Anticipation of the approach of the gunning season the Biological Survey of the Department of Agriculture has issued a circular containing regulations for the shipment, and sale, the main contents of this circular have already been published.

TROUBLE IN CATALONIA

Armed Band, Supposed to be Carlists, Near Barcelona. MADRID, Oct. 31.—The Government is dealing vigorously with what is described as a Carlist outbreak in Catalonia.

An armed band of 500 men who had assembled at Berga; fifty-one miles northwest of Barcelona, are being pursued by troops. Communication between Berga and Barcelona has been stopped. Other bands are being hunted by the military.

The Government has concentrated troops at Madrid, Saragossa, and Valencia, all ready to go to Catalonia if needed in that province. Prominent Carlists here declare that the outbreak is not a Carlist movement, but is the work of irresponsible agitators. They say that the Carlists will make no move unless they are ordered to do so by Don Carlos.

It is nowise certain that the Carlists' repudiation of connection with the trouble is not genuine, and that the uprising is not part of the purely Catalan separatist movement, which the recent industrial crisis and its attendant distress have rendered more active.

It is no secret that the Catalonian separatists regard the Madrid Government as being about as bad as it can be, and believe it to be responsible for the fiscal burdens under which the country groans. These are all the more keenly felt since Spain lost her colonial and over sea trade. Barcelona was thereby crippled if not ruined. Many mills there have been closed, thousands of workmen are unemployed, and there is general discontent.

The Cabinet is represented as being greatly anxious concerning the situation although at a meeting of the Ministers this evening General Linars, Minister of War, declared that he was easily able to crush the movement, which, he said, was due to the Carlists. Alarmist rumors prevailed at the Bourse today, where the settlement was marked by a heavy fall. These rumors were officially declared to be false, and it was added that the country, with the exception of Catalonia, was everywhere quiet.
