LEGISLATIVE.—The Prohibitory Liquor Bill was taken up again in the Senate, on Wednesday last. The House Bill was read, when on motion of Mr. Stifer all after the enacting clause was stricken out, and the Senate Bill, as reported by Mr. Kunkel, and which had passed second reading, was inserted, and the bill passed finally by the following vote:

The only material difference between the Senate bill and that of the House says the correspondent of the Philadelphia Star, is this: "The former is to be submitted to the people, for their acceptance or rejection; and if a majority of the votes polled shall be against the same, then it shall not go into effect. The latter proposes to take a vote of the people upon the bill, as a recommendation to the next Legislature to pass the same. Thus, it is perceived, the one is a law upon its receiving an affirmative vote of the people, while the other is to depend upon subsequent legislation."

On motion of Mr. SLIFER, the Senate took up on third reading, Senate bill No. 104, to consolidate the York and Maryland Line, the York and Cumberland, and the Susquehanna railroad companies with each other, and with the Baltimore and Susquehanna railroad company of the State of Maryland, into one company, to be called the Susquehanna railroad company.

The bill was further amended, the title of the consolidated company changed to the Northern Central railroad company, and the bill passed finally.

In the House.—Mr. SIMONTON, in place, a bill to repeal the act of April 12, 1852, a supplementary to the charter of the Susquehanna railroad company; also, a bill relative to the hunting of deer and other game in Union county.

The University.

When will the main building go forward? This question is frequently asked. We are glad it is asked, as it indicates a deep interest in this matter. Allow me, through the Chronicle, to give an answer in the form of a few facts. One fact is, the building will be completed. None need have any fears on this point. Their completion is simply a question of time. Moreover, the Trustees are doing all in their power to accomplish this end, and will enter upon the work at the earliest moment possible.

Another fact is, the Trustees will not on any consideration involve the institution in debt, in order to accomplish this end. It is vastly important the building should be completed, yet not so indispensable that debts embarrassing the corporation should be contracted.

union should be contracted. Though we have failed in raising the buildings as fast as was anticipated, we think we have not failed in giving to the community a school of high order, and this is vastly more important than the completion of the buildings.

But the querist may ask what has become of all the money subscribed? Had you not \$100,000, pledged? Pledged and paid are very different things. The entire sum as yet collected from the original subscription, amounts to \$3,276.88. Of the \$20,000 understood to be pledged in Lewisburg and vicinity only \$9,426.53 has been paid, and including this, but \$15,189.53 within the Northumberland Association. What remains to be collected of the original subscription, by the Charter, goes into the Endowment Fund, so that from this source no funds can be reached for building purposes.

During the past winter I have obtained in good subscriptions and cash, upwards of \$5,000 specially pledged to complete the buildings. When this fund shall have reached an amount sufficient to justify a commencement of the work, it will be placed under contract. We hope to commence building next fall, we had hoped, this spring. This is all we can say on the subject—all we know.

Allow me, however, further to say to all, that the school is now on a permanent foundation. It must and will live. Let its friends then rally around it, complete its buildings, and make it what they wish to see it,—the chief pride of Lewisburg—the first school in Pennsylvania. All may rely on the pledged word of the Board of Trustees that every dollar pledged and paid toward completing the buildings will be sacredly used for this purpose.

FOREIGN NEWS.

Four Days Later From Europe. WAR INEVITABLE. NEW YORK, April 4.—The American steamship Baltic, with Liverpool dates to the 22d ult., being four days later than the previous advices, arrived here this afternoon.

The Liverpool market for Flour and Wheat was unchanged, but Corn had declined one shilling per quarter. Yellow Corn was quoted at 40—White 42.

The Liverpool Cotton market was one, eigh lower for all grades below fair. The sales for two days were only one thousand bales.

The Liverpool Provision market had not undergone much change. Lard was dull. Pork firmer.

The London Money market was more stringent. Consols closed at 90, which is a decline.

Trade at Manchester was dull. The Car rejects all the propositions of the Western Powers for a peaceable settlement of the Eastern question, and war is now certain.

The decline in the English funds is owing to the unfavorable character of secret correspondence, in which the designs of Russia upon Turkey are clearly expressed, and the continued drains of bullion upon the Bank of England.

There are rumors current in London of the failure of a heavy house in Australia. The first portion of troops from France for Turkey, left Marseilles on Sunday evening.

There is nothing new from Constantinople. The combined fleets would soon re-enter the Black Sea.

There had been no further engagements by opposing armies, either on sea or land.

CONNECTICUT ELECTION.—The Whigs and their associates will have about 60 majority in the Lower House, and 18 or 19 of the 21 Senators.

The Legislature is undoubtedly composed of Maine Law men. Five of the eight Sheriffs elected are opposition. There are four tickets for State Officers, which the Democrats lead.
