More Week To Select Candidates

Are Making Any Race And It Appears That It Will Be a Case Of The "Office Seeking The Man" This Year.

In one more week all nominations for the city tickets must be placed and filed with the City Recorder. As yet the sentiment has not crystallized in favor of any particular candidates. The Republicans meet next Friday and the Democrats the night following. Both conventions promise to be full, free and open. If there have been any meetings of cliques, they have not yet come to the surface. Everyone seems inclined to leave it up to the conventions.

The Republicans seem to have plenty of available material for Mayor. John Hunter's name is given most frequent mention, though William Thornton, James T. Gardner have many mentions. Others are mentioned, and in ten days is a long time for more names to enter the race.

Besides the name of J. B. Forbes, present incumbent, that of W. D. Woods has been mentioned for Recorder, and there will be others. Mrs. J. L. Storr, the present treasurer, is not a favored candidate for re-nomination. It is understood that she is not to receive another term. The name of Joseph Dunkley may present itself under no condition. The Democrats will probably be given to some extent in the making of their tickets by the ticket takers. Republicans will select.

Mayor Greenwood declares that he is not a candidate, but his friends say his record is clean, efficient and aggressive and entitles him to a second term. They will do their best to have him consent to the use of his name in the Convention.

Joseph H. Storrs in mentioned frequently, but as yet he has not consented. Eli Clayton is another name frequently mentioned, but he is a busy man. The man finally selected may not be either of these.

Storrs is frequently mentioned in connection with the Democratic ticket but he is making no fight for the treasurership as yet has no support from the Democrats, but several will probably develop.

There will be no particular issue between the two parties except "the nuts" want to get "in" and they will probably want to remain. Voters, however will probably see their candidates because of their names on the question of exchange water from lower to higher lands. Several say that as the Council makes the water situation, and effort will be made to see that the farmers will be represented.

REMODELING HEATING PLANT

The Bank of American Fork has a force of plumbers busy for the ten days removing the old steam heating plant and supplanting it with a hot water. The new plant will be located in the basement, the offices and the Dunkley Confectionery.

Two Days For Registration

Those who voted at the City election, Nov. 4, 1913, will find their names on the registration lists. Those registered last year will have to register again this year, also all others whose names are not on the lists, will have to register in order to vote at the coming city election.

American Fork To Have Great Resort

Chipman's Are Planning to Erect New Buildings Out On Utah Lake—Work Probably to Commence at Early Date.

American Fork is to have a great Lake Resort, probably the finest in this county. Plans and specifications have been prepared for remodeling the Chipman resort, and if they do not miscarry, work will be commenced at an early date and the main building will be roofed in before winter. The building 50 by 80 feet will be two stories high. The lower floor will be a spacious dining room, roasting room, reading quarters and bowery and along one side will be a row of bath rooms. On the upper floor will be the ballroom, with maple floor and disappearing windows so as to give fresh air and comfort on hot summer evenings. Along the south and west sides will be wide verandas.

The building will be built out into the lake so as to give the feeling and effect of being on the water. The lake is now at its lowest level and the builders intend taking advantage of this fact to get the cement abutments out into the lake as far as possible. The resort already has one of the finest groves of trees in the state, pure, cold and abundant artesian water and lots of grass, besides one of the best sloping sandy beaches on the entire lake. With the new buildings and the Chipman's management the resort will become immensely popular.

Sufficient bath houses will be built to bring the total up to seventy-five and more bungalow tents will be added to the present number to take care of the increasing number of campers who spend from one to six weeks there during the summer. Rumors have been very persistent that when the resort is gotten in shape to take care of the crowds, the Orem people will run a branch from the interurban depot to the lake. The rumor could not be confirmed, but good authorities say that such a move would be money maker and it is well known that the Salt Lake and Orem roads are planning to connect with some lake resort as soon as the main line to Payson is completed. A name has not yet been selected for the new resort. The people will be asked to select a name and a prize will be awarded to the successful one who suggests a name that will have a suggestive meaning, characteristic of the lake and surroundings.

Should American Fork Have a Central Park

Several prominent local citizens were discussing the needs of the city recently, when the question of a city park came up. Most cities of the state have a civic beauty center, both for the convenience of the local people and visitors who may have occasion to spend a few leisure hours in the city. It was suggested that the track of land adjoining the interurban depot be purchased for this purpose, the lot occupied by the Crookston residence and the track to the rear. It was also suggested that this would be ample ground, and could be planted with trees, flowers and grass and be made a delightful place to spend a few hours of a summer afternoon and evening.

There are but few available places in the city, and they are growing fewer each year and more difficult to get. Lehi is spending \$2,000 on her new park. Pleasant Grove has a beautiful grove on Main street. Provo central park is admired by all visitors. Springville and Spanish Fork both have central beauty spots and almost everywhere well regulated city has some public place for this purpose.

Would it not be well to incorporate a plank, favoring a city park, in the political platforms for the coming city election.

DEEDS STATE ONE ACRE

The contents of the can will be hauled away at stated intervals by the city without cost to the individual.

Big Salt Ledge Found in Canyon

Is Located Near Power Plant—Earl and Eagle Let Contract For 300-feet of Tunnel.

Edward Rushton was exhibiting samples of salt, which he brought down this week, from his claims above the power plant in American Fork canyon. The samples were about one-third salt and two-thirds lime shale. The samples being shown were white salt, but he says that he also has the red variety. Only a few shots were put in and indications were that a solid ledge might be opened with a little more work. The ledges are over 20 feet thick.

It has been known for years that cattle frequented this spot, and seemed to be eating soil. This caused Mr. Rushton to search for the ledge, which he found with but little difficulty. North of the canyon forks about one mile is located an aluminum deposit, and in the Silver Lake district a 3-foot ledge of magnesium. Who knows what else the canyon contains?

The Earl and Eagle mining Co. this week let a contract for 300-feet of the tunnel that will ultimately cut the ore bearing fissures on Silver Glance Hill, when the tunnel will have reached a distance of 1,200 feet. Bell Yates has the contract and will put five men to work at once.

The Bay State mine received returns from its recent shipment of ore which netted the company \$21 per ton.

The Bay State people have recently opened up a nice bunch of ore in a new place which bears indications

of being the main ledge. Mr. Tyler who came down for the first time Wednesday and will open up the new find.

The Silver Flat people have also gotten returns from their shipment which gave a profit of less than \$15 for the entire lot, because of the big percent of zinc for which they were penalized.
