

**PLEASANT GROVE DEPARTMENT.**

**Death of Franklin Beers--Visit of Experiment Station Commissioners--Runaway Accident--Local Briefs.**

(Special Correspondence.)

Pleasant Grove, Aug. 2, 1905.  
Hundreds of people throughout the state are now mourning the loss of Franklin Beers, one of the pioneers of Pleasant Grove. He passed away peacefully at 11 p. m. July 28, at his home in Provo (240 North Academy Avenue). He had been ill for about a year and two weeks. Before his death he was taken to the L. D. S. hospital in Salt Lake City, where a delicate pelvic operation was performed. Last Thursday he was brought to his home in Provo, the doctors giving up all hopes of his recovery. From thence he began to grow weaker until his suffering was finally relieved by death.

Franklin Beers was born in New York City, Oct. 16, 1842. In 1848 he accompanied his mother and her family to Utah. In 1850 he came to live in Pleasant Grove and in later years took a prominent part in the development of this city and the county in general. He married Elizabeth Glines of Cedar Fort. They are the parents of eleven children and the grand parents of ten. He was the owner of one of the largest mercantile establishments in town, to gether with a fine dancing hall, a hotel, and a fine fruit farm. Later he extended his interests to Vernal, where he built up a large and profitable trade. Lately he had been doing an extensive business in Provo.

Brother Beers was a man of sterling honesty, and was a faithful worker in the church. He was widely known throughout the state and was honored by everyone. He was of an agreeable and hopeful nature, was a loving husband and kind father. He was energetic and hardworking. He was not old, being in the prime of life and had he lived he would have yet done much good in the world.

The children that survive him are as follows: Frank Beers, Jr., Warren Beers, Mrs. L. M. Driggs, Mrs. John Polk and Mrs. Olive Reeder, all of Vernal, and Milton Beers, Misses May, Jennie and Ethel of Provo.

The funeral was held last Tuesday in Clark's hall at this city. The hall was filled with the relatives and friends of the deceased. The speakers were Elders M. B. Ship, W. L. Hayes, B. W. Driggs, L. P. Lund, Robt. Thorpe, Alfred Harper, W. M. Frampton and Bishop Swenson. As Franklin Beers was a Blackhawk veteran his companions in arms acted as pallbearers. He was buried in the city cemetery.

The Banner joins with the community in extending to the mourners the most heartfelt sympathy.
