

Letter From Francis Wilcox

Beaumont, Mississippi, September 4, 1920.

My Dear Folks: Just finished making my report for the week and decided to spend the remaining part of the morning writing letters. Of course you always come first. Your letter dated August 26, came yesterday and it was indeed a pleasure to hear you were enjoying good health with the exception of grandma. I truly hope that by this time she is able to eat three hearty meals a day. Tuesday night last I had the honor of sleeping with Uncle Sam once more. We were tramping through the country to this place and a kind gentleman told us of a short cut through the woods. The road was very dim and when night came we were in a swamp where nobody but negroes lived or could live. We were hurrying on to some white people and lost the road. After about three hours of wandering the moon came up and we found the right trail again. It was about eleven o'clock but we walked on until we came to a river, but alas, there was no bridge, so we spread some papers down on the bank and with the clear blue sky for a roof we lay down and slept. We arose early the next morning, undressed and forded the river. We walked until noon only passing one white house and at that place they refused to give us breakfast so we thanked them kindly and went on. About ten o'clock we passed a darkey's corn field. I asked him for just one ear which he gladly gave us. That furnished us with sustenance until we came to a logging camp and boarding house. We didn't miss any meals we just postponed them from
